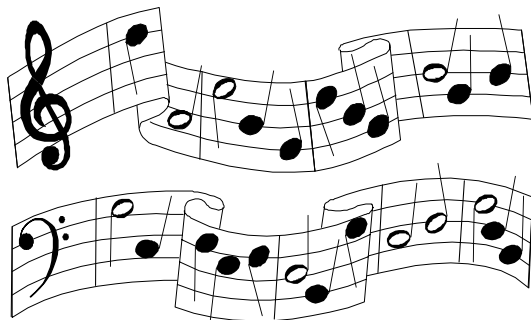


# DON'T MISS OUR JAZZ MASSES NEXT WEEKEND

## STATUE OF SAN TORIBIO FOR MEXICO

Jesus Romo, a parishioner at the Cathedral, is doing a sculpture of Saint Toribio to be placed in the parish where the saint was born.
