

## BISHOP QUINN TO CELEBRATE JAZZ MASSES

Next week's Jazz Jubilee in Sacramento will include Jazz Masses at the Cathedral – the first such since the building reopened last November.

We will have Jazz Masses on Saturday evening at 5:00 pm, and Sunday at 11:00 am and 5:00 pm. Bishop Francis Quinn, retired bishop of Sacramento, will celebrate the 5:00 pm Saturday and 11:00 am on Sunday, and he will preach at both. Bishop Richard Garcia will celebrate the 5:00 pm Sunday and preach. Bishop William Weigand, who normally celebrates, is on

vacation. Bishop Quinn was bishop of Sacramento from 1980 to 1994 and it was during his time in the diocese that the Jazz Mass tradition began.

The music at the Jazz Masses will as usual be contemporary liturgical style with jazz roots. An 75-member choir and jazz combo will be part of the celebration under the direction of Jackson Schoos, Director of Liturgy at the Cathedral, and Roy Spicer, Director of Music at St. Barbara Church in Santa Barbara Mission. Valimar Jansen, a Gospel singer from Los Angeles, will again be with us to lead the singing. Come to celebrate with us at these beautiful

## DA VINCI CODE TALK TODAY

Dr. Barry Sugarman, Executive Vice President of the University of Sacramento, will give a lecture on The Da



Vinci Code in the Lower Level of the Cathedral today Sunday, May 21, at 3:30 pm. All are welcome. Come and learn the facts about Jesus and Mary Magdalene and how to separate truth from fiction in this controversial book. Dr. Sugarman is a parishioner at the Cathedral. The movie version of Dan Brown's potboiler was released this weekend. The main plot in the The Da

Vinci Code is that Jesus and Mary Magdalene had children and their descendants live in secret today. Important clues to this are supposed to be hidden in the paintings of Renaissance artist Leonardo Da Vinci. The novel has sold more than 40 million copies in 44 languages worldwide. Several books have appeared debunking Brown's story line, which he claims is based on fact.
