

## NEW EXPANDED EDITION JUST OUT!

A new expanded edition of our coffee book "The Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament" has just come off the press. It is available in the gift shop in the Lower Level of the Cathedral for \$20.

This second edition has an extra chapter detailing the re-opening of the Cathedral on November 20, plus 18 colored photographs of the opening Mass and dedication.

Also included in the book are chapters on the history of the Cathedral, the 2005 restoration of the building, and the stained glass windows.



Contributors are Fr. Steve Avella, professor of history at Marquette University; Gary Kurutz, the curator of Special Collections at the California State Museum; KD Kurutz, Gary's wife and an expert on stained glass; Fr. William Breault, historical archivist for the Diocese of Sacramento; Marcus Breton, columnist at the Sacramento Bee; and Msgr. James Murphy, Rector of the Cathedral.

The first edition of "The Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament" sold out in three weeks.
