

PROCESSION TO MARK CORPUS CHRISTI

The Cathedral Parish will mark the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi), with a procession in downtown Sacramento. The procession, which will be led by a priest carrying the Eucharist in a monstrance, will leave Our Lady of Guadalupe Church at 12 noon today, and arrive at the Cathedral in time for the 1:00 pm Spanish Mass. Fr. Salvador Gomez, pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, will lead the procession and parishioners from both churches will participate.

Our city and Cathedral are both named after the Eucharist. The story of how this happened goes back to 1808 when Gabriel Moraga, the thirty-nine-year-old Spanish sea captain, discovered the Sacramento River long before a city appeared on its banks. Trekking up the big river on a horseback expedition, he was so struck by the beauty of the scene before his eyes in this as-yet unexplored territory that he said: "This is like the Holy Sacrament." And so he gave the river its name,

which later also became the name of the city and the cathedral. You will see a likeness of Moraga in the vestibule as you enter this Cathedral.

Following the procession, the 1:00 pm Spanish Mass at the Cathedral will be celebrated by Bishop William Weigand, and 84 children from Our Lady of Guadalupe Church will receive their First

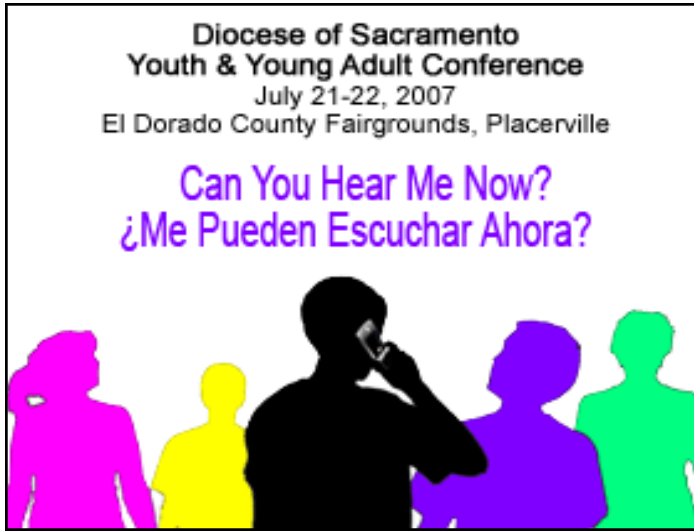

DIOCESAN YOUTH, YOUNG ADULT CONVENTION SET FOR JULY 21-22



High school students, young adults and young adult chaperones are invited to attend "Can You Hear Me Now?" the diocese's annual convention for youth and young adults, which will be held July 21-22 at the El Dorado County Fairgrounds in Placerville. Keynote speaker for the convention will be Pam Stenzel. A former crisis pregnancy counselor and well-known teen counselor, Stenzel addresses the medical, psychological, economic and moral consequences of having sex outside of marriage. Using her trademark humor and tough talk, Stenzel will present the hard facts of teen pregnancy, sexually-transmitted diseases and long-term poverty as some of the serious consequences of premarital sexual encounters. Recording artist Curtis Stephan will be the music minister for the convention and Stable Mindset and Heroes Die Trying will also provide music.

Participants can choose to attend workshops on topics such as life transitions, missionary work and vocations. Other activities will include prayer, community building, adoration and benediction. Bishop William K. Weigand will preside at Mass to conclude the conference on July 22 at noon. The collection during the liturgy will be donated to assist The Upper Room, an organization that helps the homeless and

hungry of El Dorado County, and to Catholic Relief Services.

The convention is one activity offered for young and young adults in preparation for World Youth Day, to be held in 2008 in Sydney, Australia.
