For 99 years, members of Catholic Charities USA have gathered to share ideas and reconfirm a commitment to reduce poverty. To start our centennial year, Catholic Charities is inviting members and ALL people of good will to join in on the Journey to Reduce Poverty in America.

The Catholic Charities gathering's opening session will be the first of a series of Centennial Leadership Summits across the country, where we will have the opportunity to participate in discussions with national leaders and experts in poverty reduction.

This will help shape landmark legislation that will guide our work for another 100 years and beyond.

We will have Networking, Professional Development, and Special Events. There will be opportunities to interact with CNN's David Gergen, trusted adviser to four U.S. Presidents, connect with hundreds of colleagues and share best practices, challenges and success stories, discover innovative ways to serve in a troubled economy, participate in workshops covering subjects essential for Catholic Charities and social service professionals. At the conclusion, we will celebrate Mass with Archbishop Vlazny who wrote as follows: *"It is my hope and prayer that your time in the City of Roses will provide you with opportunities to nurture your faith, deepen your commitment to ministry and service, and enrich your mutual support of each other, while finding time to relax and celebrate amidst the beauty of God's creation that is all around us in this wonderful city."*

I look forward to the outstanding hospitality in one of the "greenest" cities in America in September which is a perfect time to visit.

Second, is the Annual Meeting of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem on September 25-27, 2009 in Boise, Idaho.

The weekend's events will give us the opportunity to renew our dedication to the important mission of supporting the Christian presence in the Holy Land. Jim and Helene Paharik, current volunteers at the

Benedictines of the Dormition Abbey on Mt. Sion, will be participating in the Holy Land Education Panel. They will present information on the Beit Benedict Peace Academy on Saturday, September 26. Jim is the author of the recently published, *"The Long Journey: The Search for Peace and Justice in Jerusalem."*

We are honored to welcome as our special guest, His beatitude Michel Sabbah, retired Patriarch of Jerusalem, known for his tireless advocacy for the rights of the Church in the Holy Land. He now lives on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem and continues to serve the Church as a teacher and pastor. His latest book is, *"Faithful Witness: On Reconciliation and Peace in the Holy Land."*

We will be celebrating Vespers, Memorial, Promotions and Investiture Masses at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist.

These two blessed events are special areas in which I can serve and are a splendid part of our Catholic Church.

This weekend at our parish, I am delighted that Deacon Jorge Usi will preach on our many ministries of charity. **~ RED MASS OCTOBER 8 ~**

The annual Red Mass for attorneys, judges, elected and appointed officials, and all those working in the legal system or involved in the process of government will be held at the Cathedral on Wednesday, October 7 at 5:00 pm. Bishop Jaime Soto will preside and be the homilist. The Red Mass is the popular name for the Mass of the Holy Spirit, in which God's blessings are invoked upon all those working in civil or canon law. The liturgy's red vestments symbolize the tongues of fire and gave the name to this 800-year-old Catholic tradition which gathers together all members of the legal community, Catholic and non-Catholic alike. In the United States, the Red Mass is traditionally celebrated the Sunday before the Supreme Court session begins, which is always the second Tuesday in October. Following Mass, the St. Thomas More Award Dinner will be held at the Sutter Club. Tickets are \$75. Call (916) 753-1300 for reservations.
