

TRINITY SUNDAY

Moses led a people who believed in the existence of many gods. Moses' task was to bring them to a belief that they were committed to the one God, and no other god was to rank before the "One God." Moses' task is our challenge. What are my gods? The God I worship on Sunday, or the god I worship on payday? The God who calls me to serve, or the god that makes me want to be served?

During the time of Jesus, the manners of the Mediterranean Middle East were formal. People then and now remain very formal unless invited otherwise. The sacred name of God is not said because, among other reasons, we do not have the kind of relationship with God in which we would dare the casual use of God's name. To use God's name implies equality. Jesus certainly changed the nature of our relationship when he told us, "address God as Abba." Abba possesses an intimacy that had not previously been expressed between God and his people. Abba is a term used by children for their father or by a people for

the head of a tribe or extended family. In short, Jesus invites us to become part of his extended family—the House of God.

In similar fashion Paul tells us that we have received a Spirit of Adoption. Adoption was rare in Jewish culture. Paul's idea was radical because he fostered adoption of outsiders into the privileges of the children of God. To be adopted into the "House of God" brought privileges and responsibilities spelled out today, "Go, make disciples"—bring everyone into the House of God.

Today, we celebrate the Holy Trinity. This is more than doctrine. It is about our relationship to God. We have been called into an incredible relationship with God. Through Jesus, we are invited to call on the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity tells us who God is and how God works, and more importantly who we are. We belong to the House of God, and we have permission to say so.
