As we are in May, the special month of our Mother Mary, I encourage everyone to say the rosary.

12 PROMISES OF MARY

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the rosary shall receive signal graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the rosary.
3. The rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw hearts from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the rosary, shall not perish.
6. Whoever shall recite the rosary devoutly, applying oneself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise such a person in His justice, nor shall such perish by an unprovided death; if just, such persons remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plenitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the rosary.
10. The faithful children of the rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the rosary.
12. All those who propagate the holy rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2011

HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS of pilgrims representing countries throughout the world have registered for the 26th World Youth Day in Madrid, Spain Aug. 16-21. A special place, the Love and Life Center, a Home for English Speaking Pilgrims at the Palacio de Deportes, at 15,000-seat sports stadium in Madrid, has been set up with the assistance of the Knights of Columbus.

"We are honored to be involved in creating a home for English-speaking pilgrims at World Youth Day together with our co-hosts, the Sisters of Life, and our many cosponsors," said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson. "This will be an event filled with graces for many people, and we very much look forward to an unforgettable week and a spectacular outpouring of faith."

The center will be home to Catholic speakers, catechetical programs, musical performances, discussions and other activities throughout the week.

"The various talks, exhibits and concerts will engage the questions of the human heart: the longing for freedom, friendship, love, healing and true communion with God," said Mother Agnes Mary Donovan of the Sisters of Life. "There will also be many opportunities for prayer so that pilgrims can personally encounter the Lord."

The official theme of the 26th World Youth Day is, "Planted and built up in Jesus Christ, firm in the faith" (cf Col 2:7). In his message for the event, Pope Benedict XVI reflected on the need for Europe to rediscover its Christian roots, adding, "I would like all young people to share this experience, which can prove decisive for their lives. It is an experience of the Lord Jesus, risen and alive, and of his love for each of us."

World Youth Day was first instituted by Pope John Paul II following the success of international gatherings of young people in Rome in 1984 and 1985. While it is celebrated on the diocesan level each year on Palm Sunday, it has included major international celebrations every two to three years, beginning with Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1987.

"It is our desire to create a dynamic atmosphere into which young pilgrims can enter and experience the hope and joy that come from knowing Christ and from belonging to God's family, the Church. We pray that this endeavor will help to promote a genuine civilization of life and love throughout the world," said Mother Agnes.

EL DÍA MUNDIAL DE LA JUVENTUD 2011

CIENTOS de miles de peregrinos que representan a países de todo el mundo se han registrado para el 26th día mundial de la juventud en Madrid, España, 16-21 de agosto. Se configuró un lugar especial, el amor y el centro de la vida, un hogar para los peregrinos de habla inglesa en el Palacio de Deportes, en el estadio deportivo de Madrid habrá 15,000 asientos, con la asistencia de los Caballeros de Colón.

"Nos sentimos honrados a participar en la creación de un hogar para los peregrinos de habla inglesa en el día mundial de la juventud junto con nuestros anfitriones, las hermanas de vida y nuestros muchos copatrocinadores," dijo el Caballero Supremo Carl A. Anderson. "Se trata de un evento lleno de gracias para muchas personas y muchos esperamos una semana inolvidable y una espectacular lluvia de fe."

El centro será hogar de oradores católicos, programas de catequesis, actuaciones musicales, debates y otras actividades a lo largo de la semana.

"Las diversas charlas, exposiciones y conciertos participarán las preguntas del corazón humano: el anhelo de libertad, la amistad, el amor, la curación y la verdadera comunión con Dios," dijo la madre Agnes Mary Donovan de las hermanas de la vida. "También habrá muchas oportunidades para la oración para que los peregrinos pueden encontrarse personalmente con el Señor."

El tema oficial del 26th del Día Mundial de la Juventud es, "planeado y creado en Jesucristo, en la fe firme" (cf. Col 2: 7). En su mensaje para el evento, el Papa Benedicto XVI reflexionó sobre la necesidad de que Europa redescubra sus raíces cristianas, agregando, "quisiera que todos los jóvenes que compartan esta experiencia, sea decisiva para sus vidas. Es una experiencia del Señor Jesús, resucitado vivo y de su amor por cada uno de nosotros".

El Día Mundial de la Juventud primero fue instituido por el Papa Juan Pablo II tras el éxito de las reuniones internacionales de jóvenes en Roma en 1984 y 1985. Mientras que en el nivel diocesano se celebra cada año el domingo de Ramos, ha incluido principales celebraciones internacionales cada dos o tres años, comenzando con Buenos Aires, Argentina, en 1987.

"Es nuestro deseo de crear un ambiente dinámico en el que puedan escribir y experimentar la esperanza y la alegría que vienen de conocer a Cristo y la familia de Dios, la Iglesia de los jóvenes peregrinos. Oramos que este esfuerzo ayude a promover una verdadera civilización de vida y amor en todo el mundo," dijo la madre Agnes.

**RITE OF ACCEPTANCE
NEXT SUNDAY (MAY 15)**

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is one rite, but it is divided into periods that respect the individual's journey of faith. The Rite of Acceptance into the order of Catechumens is the first of the public rites celebrated. During this rite, the Inquirers publicly declare their intention to continue their journey toward full initiation into the Catholic Church, and the Cathedral Parish accepts them, offering support and witness during their journey. For the individual, this rite means that the beginnings of the spiritual life and the fundamentals of Christian teaching have taken root.

An important part of the Rite of Acceptance is that we, the Cathedral Parish, accept the candidates and become responsible for their guidance on their journey to the Easter Sacraments. In a very real sense, the actual formation team for the candidates and catechumens is the Cathedral Parish, everyone sitting in the pews. Please welcome the following:
