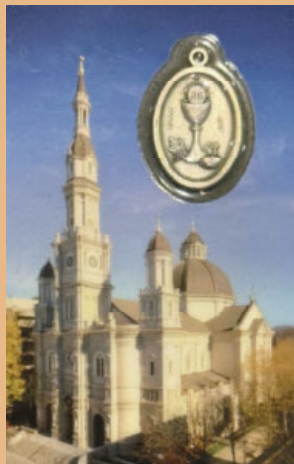

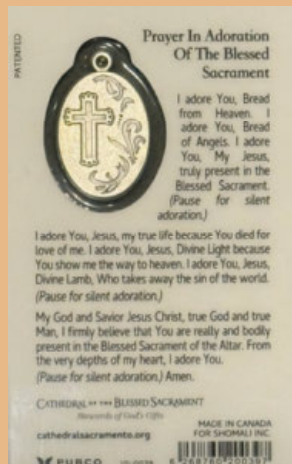

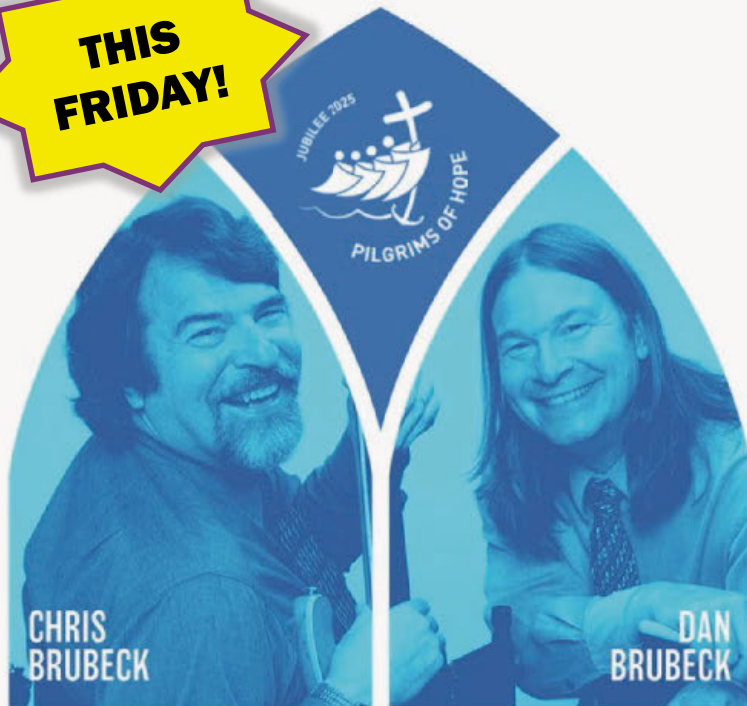

Pilgrims of Hope: Living the Gospel through Works of Charity

At the last supper, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and told them that they should follow his example, taking the place of the servant. He reminds us how we are called to honor God through our concern for the dignity of each human person and creature. The Church's social teaching is a treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amid the challenges of modern society:

- ♦ **Life and Dignity of the Human Person** Every person is precious, made in God's image and deserves respect from conception to natural death. This principle forms the foundation for the Church's teachings on issues like abortion, euthanasia, and capital punishment.
- ♦ **Call to Family, Community and Participation** Humans are social beings who thrive in community. Families are the foundational unit of society, and individuals have a right and responsibility to participate in their communities and contribute to the common good.
- ♦ **Rights and Responsibilities** All people have fundamental rights that must be protected, but these rights are inseparable from responsibilities to others.
- ♦ **Option for the Poor and Vulnerable** The Church has a special concern for the poor and marginalized. Societies should be judged on how they treat their most vulnerable members.
- ♦ **Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers** Workers have rights to fair wages, safe working conditions, and the ability to organize.
- ♦ **Solidarity** to stand in solidarity with all people, especially those who are suffering.
- ♦ **Care for God's Creation** protecting the environment and using its resources responsibly.

During the Summer months, we will examine the Church's social teachings.

En la última cena, Jesús lavó los pies a sus discípulos y les dijo que debían seguir su ejemplo, ocupando el lugar del siervo. Nos recuerda cómo estamos llamados a honrar a Dios a través de nuestra preocupación por la dignidad de cada persona y criatura humana. La doctrina social de la Iglesia es un tesoro de sabiduría para construir una sociedad justa y vivir santamente en medio de los desafíos de la sociedad moderna:

- ♦ **Vida y dignidad de la persona humana** Toda persona es preciosa, hecha a imagen de Dios, y merece respeto desde su concepción hasta su muerte natural. Este principio constituye el fundamento de las enseñanzas de la Iglesia sobre cuestiones como el aborto, la eutanasia y la pena capital.
- ♦ **Llamada a la familia, la comunidad y la participación** El ser humano es un ser social que se desarrolla en comunidad. Las familias son la unidad fundacional de la sociedad, y los individuos tienen el derecho y la responsabilidad de participar en sus comunidades y contribuir al bien común.
- ♦ **Derechos y responsabilidades** Todas las personas tienen derechos fundamentales que deben ser protegidos, pero estos derechos son inseparables de las responsabilidades para con los demás.
- ♦ **Opción por los pobres y vulnerables** La Iglesia tiene una preocupación especial por los pobres y marginados. Las sociedades deben ser juzgadas por cómo tratan a sus miembros más vulnerables.
- ♦ **Dignidad del trabajo y derechos de los trabajadores** Los trabajadores tienen derecho a un salario justo, a unas condiciones de trabajo seguras y a la posibilidad de organizarse.
- ♦ **Solidaridad** solidarizarse con todas las personas, especialmente con las que sufren.
- ♦ **Cuidar la Creación de Dios** protegiendo el medio ambiente y utilizando sus recursos de forma responsable.

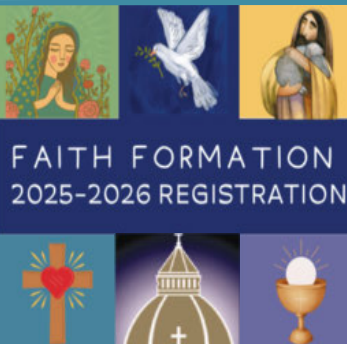

Focus of the Gospel:

Last week, our reflection was centered on being 'sent forth' with power to "tread upon serpents". At every Mass we are sent out to live the Gospel so that others may believe in God and find eternal life. Our readings for next week focus on one important aspect of the Gospel and Catholic teaching: love of Neighbor. Jesus tells a parable about a good Samaritan who shows mercy to a stranger, going out of his way to care for him. This is the bar Jesus sets for us; it is the bar where Saints are made. Saint Martin of Tours, lived this Gospel in his daily life. One day, he encountered a poor man in winter and cut his cloak in two and clothed the poor in the other half. That night, Jesus appeared to him wearing the half-cloak. A more modern example is Dorothy Day (1897-1980) lived the parable of the Good Samaritan. After years of personal struggle to find meaning in her life, she found it in the Catholic Church. Taking the Gospel seriously, she opened soup kitchens, and hospitality houses to feed, clothe and give shelter to those in need. Her witness was "living simply so that others could simply live."

Reflect:

- ♦ How did Jesus fulfill the Law of the Hebrew people in his teaching?
- ♦ How can you adopt Jesus' teaching for love of neighbor in your daily life?
- ♦ The Corporal Works of Mercy involve the care of the body: Feed the hungry, Give Drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, Visit the imprisoned, and Bury the dead. How can you incorporate these works of mercy in your family / personal life?

Enfoque del evangelio:

La semana pasada, nuestra reflexión se centró en ser «enviados» con poder para «pisar serpientes». En cada Misa somos enviados a vivir el Evangelio para que otros puedan creer en Dios y encontrar la vida eterna. Nuestras lecturas de la próxima semana se centran en un aspecto importante del Evangelio y de la doctrina católica: el amor al prójimo. Jesús cuenta una parábola sobre un buen samaritano que muestra misericordia a un forastero, desviándose de su camino para atenderle. Este es el listón que Jesús nos pone; es el listón donde se hacen los Santos. San Martín de Tours vivió este Evangelio en su vida cotidiana. Un día, se encontró con un pobre en invierno, cortó su capa en dos y vistió al pobre con la otra mitad. Esa noche, Jesús se le apareció vistiendo la mitad del manto. Un ejemplo más moderno es el de Dorothy Day (1897-1980), que vivió la parábola del Buen Samaritano. Tras años de lucha personal por encontrar sentido a su vida, lo encontró en la Iglesia católica. Tomándose en serio el Evangelio, abrió comedores sociales y casas de acogida para alimentar, abrigar y dar cobijo a los necesitados. Su testimonio era «vivir sencillamente para que otros pudieran sencillamente vivir».

Reflejar:

- ♦ ¿Cómo cumplió Jesús la Ley del pueblo hebreo en su enseñanza?
- ♦ ¿Cómo puedes adoptar la enseñanza de Jesús sobre el amor al prójimo en tu vida cotidiana?
- ♦ Las Obras Corporales de Misericordia implican el cuidado del cuerpo: Dar de comer al hambriento, Dar de beber al sediento, Vestir al desnudo, Albergar a los sin techo, Visitar a los enfermos, Visitar a los encarcelados y Enterrar a los muertos. ¿Cómo puedes incorporar estas obras de misericordia a tu vida familiar y personal?

Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

EVANGELIO LC 10, 1-12. 17-20

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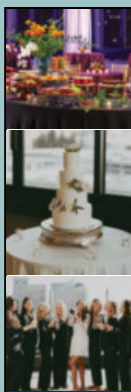
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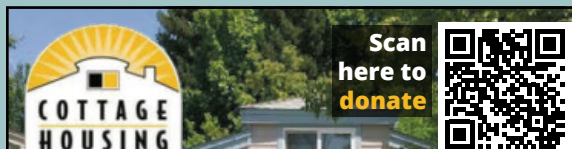
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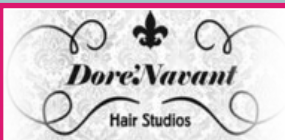
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
