Social Teaching of the Church The Poor and the Vulnerable

**"What you do

Pilgrims of Hope: Our Human Rights / Gifts are to be shared

Over the summer months, we have been reflection on Catholic Social Teaching. Last week we considered the third one, the Rights and Responsibilities of a mature (serious) Catholic. This week we are going to consider 'Option for the Poor and Vulnerable'. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: *"The Church's love for the poor . . . is a part of her constant tradition." This love is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes, of the poverty of Jesus, and of his concern for the poor. . . . "Those who are oppressed by poverty are the object of a preferential love on the part of the Church which, since her origin and in spite of the failings of many of her members, has not ceased to work for their relief, defense and liberation"* (CCC #244, 248) St. Paul VI, stated, "He who has the goods of this world and sees his brother in need and closes his heart to him, how does the love of God abide in him?" (1 Jn 3:17) Everyone knows that the Fathers of the Church laid down the duty of the rich toward the poor in no uncertain terms. They will be with us always, and we have a duty to help them.

Los oprimidos por la pobreza son objeto de un amor preferencial por parte de la Iglesia, la cual, desde sus orígenes y a pesar de los fallos de muchos de sus miembros, no ha cesado de trabajar por su alivio, defensa y liberación" (CIC #244, 248) St. Pablo VI, afirmó: "El que tiene los bienes de este mundo y ve a su hermano necesitado y le cierra su corazón, ¿cómo permanece en él el amor de Dios?" (1 Jn 3, 17) Todos saben que los Padres de la Iglesia establecieron sin ambages el deber de los ricos para con los pobres. Siempre estarán con nosotros, y tenemos el deber de ayudarles.

Wisdom 18:6-9

Summary of the Readings:

- **First Reading** – Wisdom 18:6-9: The ancestors had foreknowledge of the Passover, giving them courage. The salvation of the just and destruction of foes were awaited.
- **Responsorial Psalm** – Psalms 33: The righteous are urged to rejoice in the Lord. The people chosen by God are blessed, and the Lord's gaze is upon those who respect Him. They await His mercy and protection.
- **Second Reading** – Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19: Abraham's unwavering faith in God's promise led him to a foreign land, where he and his descendants flourished. Their spiritual journey symbolizes a yearning for a heavenly homeland.
- **Gospel** – Luke 12:32-48: Jesus warns his disciples to be ready for his return at any time. He emphasizes the importance of faithfulness and responsibility, especially for those entrusted with much.

Our readings for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C teaches about faith, readiness, and trust in God. The readings encourage believers to stay faithful, prepare for what is to come, and rely on God's promises.

Reflect:

- ♦ What does it mean to be ready for God in daily life? How do we practice it?
- ♦ How can I trust God more when I face uncertainty?
- ♦ What attachments in my life keep me from focusing on God?
- ♦ Pray with Psalm 33.

Resumen de las lecturas:

- **Primera lectura** - Sabiduría 18:6-9: Los antepasados conocían de antemano la Pascua, lo que les infundía valor. Se esperaba la salvación de los justos y la destrucción de los enemigos.
- **Salmo responsorial** - Salmo 33: Se exhorta a los justos a alegrarse en el Señor. El pueblo elegido por Dios es bendecido, y la mirada del Señor se dirige a los que le respetan. Esperan su misericordia y su protección.
- **Segunda lectura** - Hebreos 11,1-2.8-19: La fe inquebrantable de Abraham en la promesa de Dios le llevó a una tierra extranjera, donde él y sus descendientes florecieron. Su viaje espiritual simboliza el anhelo de una patria celestial.
- **Evangelio** - Lucas 12:32-48: Jesús advierte a sus discípulos que estén preparados para su regreso en cualquier momento. Subraya la importancia de la fidelidad y la responsabilidad, sobre todo para aquellos a quienes se ha confiado mucho.

Nuestras lecturas del 19º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario del Año C nos hablan de la fe, la disponibilidad y la confianza en Dios. Las lecturas animan a los creyentes a permanecer fieles, prepararse para lo que está por venir y confiar en las promesas de Dios.

- ♦ ¿Qué significa estar preparado para Dios en la vida cotidiana? ¿Cómo lo practicamos?
- ♦ ¿Cómo puedo confiar más en Dios cuando me enfrento a la incertidumbre?

August 3, 2025

READING 1 ECC 1:2; 2:21-23

Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!

Here is one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave property. This also is vanity and a great misfortune. For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun? All his days sorrow and grief are his occupation; even at night his mind is not at rest. Brothers and sisters:

If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of

what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. Stop lying to one another, since you have taken off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all and in all.

Then he told them a parable. "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."
