Cathedral Tours Docent Ministry

The Cathedral Tours Docent Ministry is currently enjoying a period of growth and richness. We enthusiastically share the history of Sacramento and the Cathedral's beautiful works of art and

stunning historical architecture. Our ministry received favorable coverage in the Sacramento Bee (article and video) and the Cathedral is featured in Visit Sacramento among the most historical places to visit in the city. Therefore, we invite everyone to come and join us on an unforgettable complimentary tour through time.

The Cathedral Tours Docent Ministry was created soon after the 2005 renovation of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament to satisfy interest stirred in Sacramento residents curious to see the changes, modifications, and improvements. After the initial wave of interest subsided, the Cathedral tours settled into regular 45-50 minute Sunday tours, in English after the 8 am and 10 am Masses and in Spanish after the 12 noon Mass. These are still considered our "core tours". Recently the tours ministry has expanded to offer more tours in English as well as Mandarin/Cantonese.

Our current goals are to integrate into the Cathedral community and to connect more intentionally with the world beyond. We trained and graduated five new docents since November 2024, bringing our total number to 20, an increase of 25% in volunteer staff. These new docents underwent a rigorous four to six-month training program, learning wide-ranging subjects on the history, art, and architecture of the Cathedral as well as understanding the theological points that our artwork symbolically illustrates.

To stay informed and up-to-date, docents attend one or two Continuing Education classes each year. Recently our guest speakers included experts in the making and maintaining of ecclesiastical stained glass windows; the hagiography and significance of St. Toribio Romo González, whose relics we treasure in our main Altar; and soon a much anticipated presentation by Msgr. James Murphy on the challenges and rewards of the latest renovation/restoration of the Cathedral from 2003-05, in which he was directly involved.



Ministerio de Docentes de Visitas a la Catedral

El Ministerio de Guías de Visitas a la Catedral se encuentra actualmente en pleno crecimiento y prosperidad. Compartimos con entusiasmo la historia de Sacramento, las hermosas obras de arte y la impresionante arquitectura histórica de la Catedral. Nuestro ministerio recibió una cobertura favorable en el Sacramento Bee (artículo y video) y la Catedral figura en Visit Sacramento entre los lugares más históricos de la ciudad. Por lo tanto, los invitamos a todos a unirse a nosotros en un inolvidable recorrido gratuito a través del tiempo.

El Ministerio de Docentes de Visitas a la Catedral fue creado poco después de la renovación de la Catedral del Santísimo Sacramento en 2005 para satisfacer el interés despertado en los residentes de Sacramento, curiosos por ver los cambios, modificaciones y mejoras. Después de que la ola inicial de interés disminuyó, las visitas a la Catedral se establecieron en visitas regulares de domingo de 45 a 50 minutos, en inglés después de las misas de las 8 am y 10 am y en español después de la misa del mediodía. Estas todavía se consideran nuestras "visitas principales".

Recientemente, el ministerio de visitas se ha expandido para ofrecer más visitas en inglés, así como en mandarín/cantonés.

Nuestras metas actuales son integrarnos a la comunidad de la Catedral y conectarnos más intencionalmente con el mundo más allá. Capacitamos y graduamos a cinco nuevos docentes desde noviembre de 2024, lo que elevó nuestro número total a 20, un aumento del 25% en el personal voluntario. Estos nuevos docentes se sometieron a un riguroso programa de capacitación de cuatro a seis meses, aprendiendo temas amplios sobre la historia, el arte y la arquitectura de la Catedral, además de comprender los puntos teológicos que nuestra obra de arte ilustra simbólicamente.

Para mantenerse informados y actualizados, los docentes asisten a una o dos clases de Educación Continua cada año. Recientemente, nuestros oradores invitados incluyeron expertos en la fabricación y mantenimiento de vitrales eclesiásticos; la hagiografía y el significado de Santo Toribio Romo González, cuyas reliquias atesoramos en nuestro Altar principal; y pronto una presentación muy esperada de Monseñor James Murphy sobre los desafíos y las recompensas de la última renovación/restauración de la Catedral de 2003 a 2005, en la que participó directamente.

Jesus the good teacher

“My teaching is not mine but his who sent me.”

- Jesus as quoted in John 7:16

Pilgrims of Hope: Called to echo the faith with our lives.

Reflecting on the conclusion of this year, our Faith Formation community has found that the one true teacher of us all is Jesus Christ. As catechists, we see it every day we stand before a class of children or adults; we see God's grace opening the hearts to His truth. We are simply humble instruments called by baptism to proclaim the Word of God. Saint John Paul II, Pope, stated: *“Christ-centered catechesis has the intention to transmit not one's own teaching or that of some other master, but the teaching of Jesus Christ...Every catechist should be able to apply to himself the mysterious words of Jesus: “My teaching is not mine but his who sent me.”* (Catechesis Tradendae, #6) Handing on the Truth—or the mystery—of Christ is how we are to live each day, guiding everyone around us to God through Christ.



Reflexionando sobre la conclusión de este año, nuestra comunidad de Formación en la Fe ha descubierto que el único y verdadero maestro de todos nosotros es Jesucristo. Como catequistas, lo vemos cada día que estamos ante una clase de niños o adultos; vemos la gracia de Dios abriendo los corazones a su verdad. Somos simplemente humildes instrumentos llamados por el bautismo a proclamar la Palabra de Dios. San Juan Pablo II, Papa, afirmó: *“La catequesis cristocéntrica tiene la intención de transmitir no la propia enseñanza o la de algún otro maestro, sino la enseñanza de Jesucristo... Todo catequista debe ser capaz de aplicarse a sí mismo las misteriosas palabras de Jesús: «Mi enseñanza no es mía, sino de quien me ha enviado».* (Catechesis Tradendae, n° 6) Transmittiendo la Verdad -o el misterio- de Cristo es como debemos vivir cada día, guiando a todos los que nos rodean hacia Dios por medio de Cristo.

Prepare: Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2:1-11
Psalms 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34
1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13
John 14:15-16, 23b-26

Focus of the Gospel:

This coming Sunday is the Solemnity of Pentecost, and the focus is the coming of the Holy Spirit, the 3rd Divine Person of the Most Holy Trinity. In our spiritual lives, we receive the first outpouring of the Holy Spirit at baptism, making a spiritual home in our souls for the Most Holy Trinity to dwell. In our Gospel, Jesus emphasized the importance of obedience to his commandments as a sign of true love for him. He promised the Father would send an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with his followers forever. This Spirit will teach and remind them of Jesus' teachings, which are also the Father's. Jesus and the Father will dwell with those who listen to and follow these teachings.

Alone or with your Family / Friends

- ◆ How often do you ask the Holy Spirit to guide you: in your decisions? Your studies? Your preparations?
- ◆ On the first day of the Flocknote Novena, we are reminded of the spiritual gift of Fortitude—the strength to persevere when facing difficult things. What are you facing that you may want to ask for an increase of the gift of Fortitude?
- ◆ Pray Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34.

Liturgy of the Word

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Reading I Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

Brothers and sisters:

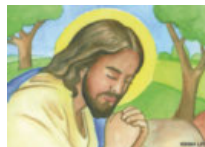
May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe, in accord with the exercise of his great might: which he worked in Christ, raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens, far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion, and every name that is named not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.

Primera Lectura

Hechos 1, 1-11

En mi primer libro, querido Teófilo, escribí acerca de todo lo que Jesús hizo y enseñó, hasta el día en que ascendió al cielo, después de dar sus instrucciones, por medio del Espíritu Santo, a los apóstoles que había elegido. A ellos se les apareció después de la pasión, les dio numerosas pruebas de que estaba vivo y durante cuarenta días se dejó ver por ellos y les habló del Reino de Dios.

Un día, estando con ellos a la mesa, les mandó: “No se alejen de Jerusalén. Aguarden aquí a que se cumpla la promesa de mi Padre, de la que ya les he hablado: Juan bautizó con agua; dentro de pocos días ustedes serán bautizados con el Espíritu Santo”.
