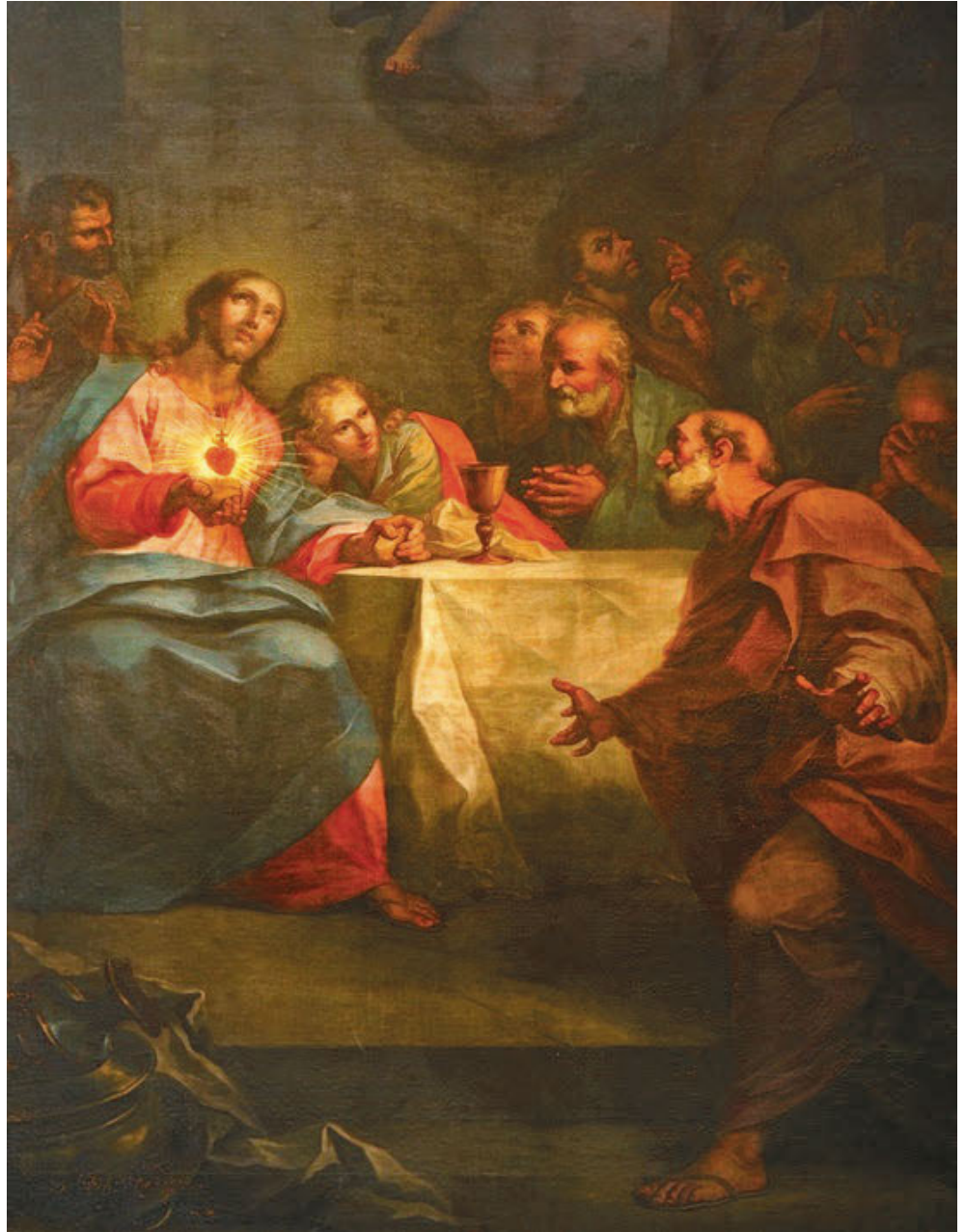

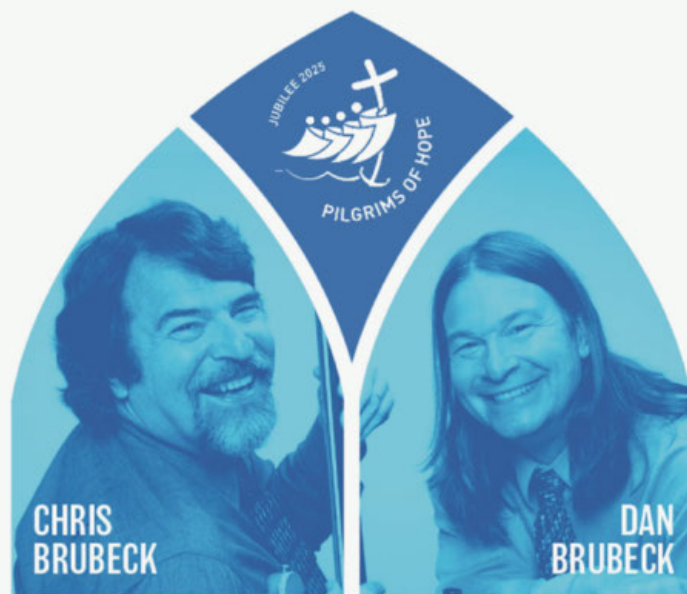

Ministry Spotlight/Ministerio destacado

On Saturday, May 17, the **13TH ANNUAL MARIAN CORONATION AND SANTACRUZAN FESTIVAL** was hosted by the Cathedral Filipino-American Ministry and the 2000 Hail Mary Devotion Prayer Group. The celebration included a mass presided by Father Michael O'Reilly, a Cathedral tour, rosary, procession, and fellowship reception. We are blessed and grateful for everyone who celebrated with us and all who contributed to our fundraising through souvenir ads and raffle tickets. The funds will support the Cathedral's Religious Education program and Cathedral repair and art restoration.

The Marian Coronation refers to ceremonially crowning a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary with flowers, accompanied by hymns and prayers. The tradition has roots in Revelation 12:1 where Mary is described in this way: "A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars."

The Filipino Santacruzán tradition commemorates the quest of Queen Helena of Constantinople to find the True Cross: the cross upon which Jesus was crucified. The Santacruzán procession involves participants dressed in beautiful costumes, often representing Queen Helena and the different titles of the Blessed Mary. These participants are known as sagalas. Through these devotions, we witness the beauty and faith in Mother Mary's intercession as our Queen and Blessed Mother. To quote new Pope Leo XIV, "As the Mother never abandons her children, you must also be faithful to the Mother."

Ruzyl de las Verlas (Queen Helena), Arlynne Desiderio (Queen of Hope), Hind Markus (Queen of the Rosary), Aurora Perez (Queen of Faith), Carolina Joaquin (Queen of the Stars), Alejandra Keaton (Queen of Heaven), and Alexa Fernandez (Queen of Flowers). We also extend our sincerest appreciation to our Santacruzán sponsors for their generous financial support and commitment towards this good cause. We also want to acknowledge the Natomas Dancers and their choreographer MayetEva Delfin, Viva Pit Senior Choir and their choir director Jay J Montecillo, the Cathedral staff and volunteers, Santacruzán angels, and arch bearers for making this a joyous celebration with their time and talent.

Pilgrims of Hope: Receive the Holy Spirit to Guide Us in Faith.

Here at the Cathedral, we are committed to becoming a true community of disciples. When Jesus began his earthly ministry, he gathered people to follow him as his disciples—or students. They would learn by watching, listening and following the example of Jesus. After a time of following, Jesus sent them out to do their own works. And after Jesus fulfilled his earthly ministry, he instructed the disciples to carry on his work. He said, ***“You are witnesses of these things ... stay until you are clothed with power from on high.”*** These were Jesus’ last words before he returned to the Father in Heaven. Did you notice that the disciples were not given the Holy Spirit right away? There was a time of waiting, praying and preparation. This is what Family Faith Formation is all about. We are called year-by-year to continue to be formed in the faith so to be ready to use his Spiritual Gifts.

Focus of the Gospel:

Trinity Sunday Year C invites us to reflect on the mystery and unity of the Holy Trinity. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit work together in perfect harmony, guiding us to live according to God's truth and plan. This mystery shows us how God can be beyond our understanding and yet very close to us. The Father is in heaven, Jesus walked on earth, and the Holy Spirit is with us now. The unity of the Trinity is a model for us. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit work together in harmony, we are called to live in unity and share God's love with others.

This is how we can reflect the Trinity's love in the world.

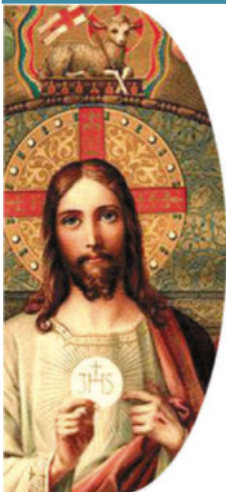

PENTECOST SUNDAY

June 8, 2025

Reading 1 Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

Brothers and sisters:

No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

DOMINGO DE PENTECOSTÉS

8 de junio de 2025

PRIMERA LECTURA

HCH 2, 1-11

El día de Pentecostés, todos los discípulos estaban reunidos en un mismo lugar. De repente se oyó un gran ruido que venía del cielo, como cuando sopla un viento fuerte, que resonó por toda la casa donde se encontraban. Entonces aparecieron lenguas de fuego, que se distribuyeron y se posaron sobre ellos; se llenaron todos del Espíritu Santo y empezaron a hablar en otros idiomas, según el Espíritu los inducía a expresarse.

En esos días había en Jerusalén judíos devotos, venidos de todas partes del mundo. Al oír el ruido, acudieron en masa y quedaron desconcertados, porque cada uno los oía hablar en su propio idioma.

Atónitos y llenos de admiración, preguntaban: "¿No son galileos, todos estos que están hablando? ¿Cómo, pues, los oímos hablar en nuestra lengua nativa?
