

# Reflections and Readings

## Stewardship Reflection



Today's readings focus on a theme of "sojourning." As Christian stewards, we know our lives are a sojourn toward the ultimate destination of heaven.

Our Gospel passage today describes the sojourn of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. The two are dejected and despondent after Jesus' death. They knew Jesus personally. They had heard the Gospel message directly from His lips. They heard the testimony of the women who discovered the empty tomb of our Lord and saw a vision of angels announcing He was alive. They had been informed by other disciples who went to the tomb that all was exactly as the women reported.

How much more obvious could the Good News be? And yet, at times, the reaction of the two disciples describes our own stewardship journey, doesn't it? We have the fullness of the Catholic faith, the power of the sacraments, and the support of our parish family. Yet, we often lose our way. We fail to see all the gifts we have been given. We lack trust in the perfect goodness and almighty power of God.

But notice what happens to the two men when their eyes are opened once again, and they recognize Jesus in the Eucharist — the "breaking of the bread." They are transformed! Their hearts are set on fire with love for the Lord and their faith. They recall that their hearts began "burning within" as the Lord was explaining the Scriptures to them. When we find we have lost our way, we can go to the same sources as the two disciples on the road to Emmaus — the Scriptures and the Eucharist.

In this Easter season, resolve to feast deeply on these two sources of grace. They are the fuel that will propel us on our journey towards heaven.






## The Scarlet and the Black





## Kids' Corner **Esquina de niños**

### Reading the Scriptures

In today's Gospel reading two disciples were walking together and thinking sadly about how Jesus had just been tortured and killed. Then Jesus started walking with them- but they didn't recognize Him. He explained to them what the Scriptures had said about Him suffering and dying. He helped them to understand what God's plan had been.



Every time we go to Mass we hear about Jesus in the Gospel reading. But we don't need to wait until Mass to learn about Jesus. You can read the Bible every day. God wants us to know Him better so we can love Him more. And the more we love Him the happier we will be.

Do you have a children's Bible? Maybe your Mom or Dad can read to you from the big Bible a little every morning or night. Reading saint stories also helps us to know God through His friends. Try to read or listen to some of the Bible or the life of a saint every day!



## Family Bible Moment

In our Gospel this Sunday, we found ourselves traveling from Jerusalem with a couple of Jesus' disciples. They were discouraged following the death of Jesus, and bewildered of the rumors they heard that he was alive. Jesus walked with them on the way to the town of Emmaus and explained using the scriptures of the necessity to die and to rise from the dead. He reveals himself in the breaking of the bread.

Looking ahead to next week—the 4th Sunday of Easter—Jesus calls himself the Shepherd, who calls His sheep by name.

**Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 10:1-10**

- What is it like to be called by name? Do we feel we belong? Do we feel we matter? Of course we do! Each of us were called by name in our Baptism, and we entered the "gate" of the Kingdom of God.
- Jesus says that the "...sheep hear and know the voice of the Shepherd and they follow Him." How well do you know the voice of Jesus? Do you recognize His holy word? How do you put it into practice?
- Jesus came so that we might have life to the full—a life that is eternal, never-ending. But we must be willing to stay close to Jesus—the Good Shepherd. What do you do to stay close to Jesus?



## Our Road to Heaven Theme: Walking Together with Jesus

This year, our Faith Formation Families studied the third pillar of the Catechism of the Catholic Church in their theme: "Road to Heaven". We began by loading up in our "Road to Heaven" van (thank you Leopoldo!), charting our course together toward our ultimate Goal: Heaven. This year we focused on the Moral Life, of how we live out our Christian discipleship through our actions and daily lives. We spent time exploring the following themes:

**Our Final Destiny**—how we are made for Heaven, in the Image/Likeness of God, to be happy.

**Conscience & God's Law**—following God's way leads to our holiness and friendship with God.


**Virtues:** what are they and how do we practice them? Mastering Virtue leads us to holiness. We focused on the 3 Theological Virtues (Faith, Hope, Love) and the 4 Cardinal Virtues (Prudence, Fortitude, Temperance, and Justice)

**The 10 Commandments**—how to love God and love our neighbor with all of our heart, mind, soul and strength, loving our neighbor as ourselves.

**The Beatitudes**— from Matthew, Chapter 5, we learned from Jesus that those who follow God's way are blessed. The beatitudes teach us the proper attitude of Christian love with Jesus.

**The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy**—we learned to love our neighbors and how to take care of their bodily (corporal) and spiritual needs. These works demonstrate our faith.

Our journey this year is quickly coming to a close, but we are already getting ready our theme for 2023-2024: **the Fourth Pillar of the Catechism—Christian Prayer**. What does it mean to pray? It is having relationship with God be communicating with Him. We will explore different ways to pray.

## A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥70 (Mark 谷3:31-35) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

Some Christians' bodies are inside the church; however, their hearts are outside the church. In fact, even some are outside the church; their hearts are still inside the church.

When the mother of Jesus came to visit Jesus, she was standing outside the house because it was a full house. Nevertheless, her heart was still with Jesus, her son. Mary asked to see Jesus as the crowd told Jesus, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, asking for you." Noteworthy is that Jesus did not go outside to meet his mother and brothers but still remained inside the house and asked, "Who are my mother and my brothers?"

This question highlights the real relationship between God and humans, i.e. faith. God is always faithful to the covenant made with people. Thus, whoever keeps the love covenant with God, s/he will be Jesus' family member as Jesus insisted: "whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother." The requirement of becoming Jesus' family members is not by blood but faith. Or better said; the blood of Jesus' family is faith.

The verb "does" (poiēsē) denotes a person who carries out and executes God's will and meets God's love commandment. Mary the mother of Jesus really did God's will to the summit that she gave the birth of the Son of God. In other words, all members of the new family must do the will of God; otherwise, they were still outside even if they were Jesus' blood family. Thus, those who belong to Jesus' faith family are the ones who accept the revelation of God's kingdom and become one of the builders. The best way to become Jesus' family members is to go through conversion and believe in the good news. While Jesus' blood family thought that he was insane (Mark 3:20-21), they made themselves outside Jesus' family of faith.

Becoming members of Jesus' faith family is by doing the will of God, not the links of blood.

一些基督徒的身體雖然在聖堂內；然而，心卻在教會之外。事實上，縱然有些信徒人在聖堂之外；心，卻在教會內。

當耶穌的母親來看望耶穌時，正站屋外，因為滿屋子是人。可是，她心仍然與兒子耶穌連在一起。群眾告訴耶穌聖母要求見他：“看，你的母親和你的兄弟在外邊找你。”值得注意的，耶穌沒有出去見他母親和兄弟，依然留在屋裡，問：“誰是我的母親和我的兄弟？”

這問題突出天主與人的真實關係，即信仰。天主永遠信守與人所立盟約；因此，凡跟天主守約的，就是耶穌家人；正如耶穌強調：“誰奉行天主的旨意，他就是我的兄弟、姊妹和母親。”成為耶穌家人的要求不是血緣，而是信德。或更好說，耶穌家族的血脈，是信德。

動詞“奉行” (poiēsē) 表示執行天主旨意，滿全天主愛的誠命。聖母遵行天主旨意到達高峰，就是誕下天主子耶穌。換言之，信德之家所有成員都必須奉行天主旨意；否則，即使他們是耶穌血親，仍然漂流在外。因此，屬於耶穌信德之家的人，就是那些接受天國並且是建立天國其中一員。

要成為耶穌家人最佳方法，是通過皈依並且相從福音。縱然耶穌的血緣家庭跟他有家族關係，卻認為他執行天主旨意是發瘋（谷3:20-21），結果讓自己脫離耶穌的信德之家。

耶穌家人都是奉行天主旨意，非血緣關係。
