

Stewardship Reflection

Today's readings are all about love — the radical love of God for His people and the radical love we are called to live out in response. The stewardship way of life is nothing more and nothing less than the practical application of loving God and neighbor in our daily lives.

Jesus sums up the message of all the prophets, as well as the purpose of all God's laws in today's Gospel passage, from Matthew. It is a message we have likely grown up hearing — but it is so beautiful and so challenging, it bears repeating again and again. It is Christ's response to a question about which commandment is greatest. His answer reveals both the greatest and the second greatest commandments.

He says, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind... The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

How is the second like the first? What do the two commands have in common? Love.

Love God first and love neighbor as self. This is the heart of the stewardship way of life — simple enough for a child to understand, challenging enough to be the life's work of every "grown-up."

Reflexión sobre la mayordomía

Las lecturas de hoy tienen que ver con el amor: el amor radical de Dios por su pueblo y el amor radical que estamos llamados a vivir en respuesta. La forma de vida de mayordomía es nada más y nada menos que la aplicación práctica de amar a Dios y al prójimo en nuestra vida diaria.

Jesús resume el mensaje de todos los profetas, así como el propósito de todas las leyes de Dios en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, de Mateo. Es un mensaje que probablemente hemos crecido escuchando, pero es tan hermoso y tan desafiante que vale la pena repetirlo una y otra vez. Es la respuesta de Cristo a una pregunta acerca de cuál mandamiento es el más importante. Su respuesta revela tanto el mandamiento más grande como el segundo mandamiento más grande.

Él dice: "Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente... La segunda es semejante a ésta: amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo".

¿En qué se parece el segundo al primero? ¿Qué tienen en común los dos comandos? Amar.

Ama a Dios primero y ama al prójimo como a ti mismo. Este es el corazón de la forma de vida de la mayordomía: lo suficientemente simple como para que un niño lo entienda, lo suficientemente desafiante como para ser el trabajo de la vida de cada "adulto".

All Hallows Eve (Halloween)

The Church's All Hallows Eve traditions are at best confused in the United States. Originally celebrated in the 4th century as the Eastern Church's Feast of Martyrs around Eastertime, Pope Gregory IV established the commemoration of All Saints Day in 835 in May. Later in the 9th century, it was moved to November 1 to counter the Celtic pagan feast of Samhain, the Druid's New Year. Part of the confusion over All Hallows Eve is that some of the traditions of the Druids are still in use today (Jack-O-Lanterns, black cats, ghostly costumes). *Halloween can still be a Christian celebration, kept as the Vigil of All Saints Day.* Halloween costumes should reflect gospel values. Trick-or-treat is just good, old fashioned hospitality; in Christ's name, we welcome all who knock. Walking on the streets in masks reminds us of our journey to heaven. Once our journey is done, we will take off our masks and see ourselves as we truly are—the beloved Children of God, the saints in glory.

Día de los Muertos

"Día de los Muertos" es simplemente un nombre popular en español latinoamericano para la Conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos, que se lleva a cabo cada 2 de noviembre. El nombre popular en inglés es Día de los Fieles Difuntos.

Hay muchas costumbres antiguas asociadas a la conmemoración de los muertos: visitas al cementerio con la limpieza y el orden de las tumbas, la instalación de altares conmemorativos, una comida compartida junto a la tumba con platos especiales servidos en el día, etc. Todas estas son buenas costumbres y se remontan a los primeros días de la fe cristiana. Los santos y los Padres de la Iglesia aconsejaron siempre cierta moderación por parte de los fiesteros; podemos encontrar esto descrito en las Confesiones de San Agustín, en las que su madre, Santa Mónica, tiene que observar las costumbres menos generosas de la Iglesia en Milán, aunque en su norte de África natal las conmemoraciones de los muertos eran más festivas.

El punto principal del día es la oración, las obras de misericordia y la penitencia por nuestros queridos difuntos, combinados con el medio más poderoso para ayudarlos a alcanzar su patria celestial: el santo sacrificio de la Misa. El "Día de los Muertos" es un día para mostrar nuestro amor por los difuntos intercediendo por ellos y acelerando su viaje desde la purificación hasta la bienaventuranza del cielo, desde donde orarán por nosotros con gratitud.

Gospel Focus:

The Scriptures give us many images of God: shepherd, king, eagle with her young, and so forth. Next Sunday's readings suggest the image of God as a creative parent. The reading from Malachi is a call for unity, both in what is taught and in the relationships among believers. Our motivation for unity is a recognition we are all created by the same God. In the Gospel, Jesus challenges the priests for not teaching the truth, and they do not practice what they preach, therefore having a disunity even within themselves.


This month we dug into our theme of prayer. Parents pondered the scriptural figures of Abraham and Moses.

Why is Abraham called the 'Father of our Faith'?



A Glimpse of Spirituality 灵修一瞥95 (Luke路 10:1-9)

Jesus sent out his seventy-two disciples to announce God's kingdom. The disciples were warned that they were sent as "lambs among wolves." What should they do in order to deal with this hard time? The disciples, in fact, should not depend on anything or anybody except on God's grace.

To the church, the proclamation of God's kingdom is not simply a human project, and hence the church needs strength from God to do the ministry. God gives us the power to announce the presence of Jesus with our lives. Thus, the radical requirement is that the church should give up even the necessities so as to be both a living act of faith in God and "walking signs" to those who see them. The detachment from material goods would enable the church to uphold the absolute priority of preaching the good news.

The detachment is a spiritual exercise for the disciples to trust more deeply in God and would rely humbly on the hospitality of those who received them. Their life-style is already a proclamation of God's good news: "The kingdom of God has come near to you." That is to say, the best way to tell the whole world that God's kingdom is at hand is the disciples' witness to Jesus. The verb "come near" (Engiken) means approaching. The concrete way to make God's kingdom approachable is, as Jesus insisted, "Heal the sick in it." The adjective "sick" (astheneis) points to both physical and moral weaknesses. The disciples were sent to deal with the sick world. The recovery of sick people from diseases or sins is the sign of the kingdom of God.

As Jesus foretold, the disciples were like "lambs in the midst of wolves." This is the rejection or persecution that the disciples would encounter in future. So Jesus consoled them by saying "if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you." Peace of mind is also a sign of the presence of God's kingdom.

耶穌派遣七十二門徒去宣講天國，被警告：如同進入“狼群中的羔羊”。面對福傳困難，門徒該做什麼？事實上，除了天主恩寵之外，門徒不需依靠任何其他人物。

對於教會，宣講天國不是人的計劃，因此需要天主力量來執行牧職。天主賜予力量，讓門徒在生命中宣告耶穌臨在。因此，最根本要求，是教會甚至放下必需品，好能活生生見證天主的眷顧，同時成為世上“行走的標記”。脫離物質財富，將使教會學習堅持宣講福音是絕對優先。

放下物質羈絆，是神修鍛煉，讓門徒們能夠更加信靠天主，並謙卑地依靠那些接待他們的人。因此，門徒這種生活方式已經是在宣告福音：“天主的國已經臨近你們了。”也就是說，向世界宣告天國臨近，最好方式莫過於為耶穌作證。

動詞“臨近”（Engiken）意即接近或來臨，正如耶穌所強調，讓天國變得平易近人的具體方法，是“要醫治城中的病人”。形容詞“病”（astheneis）既指身體上的疾病，也指道德上的弱點。門徒被派遣去面對病態世界，病人從疾病或罪人從罪惡中康復，是天國臨近的標記。

正如耶穌預言，門徒“猶如羔羊往狼群中”；這就是門徒將會遭遇的拒絕或迫害。耶穌安慰說：“那裡如有和平之子，你們的和平就要停留在他身上；否則，仍歸於你們。”

苦難中的心靈平安，也是天國臨近標記。

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
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


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
