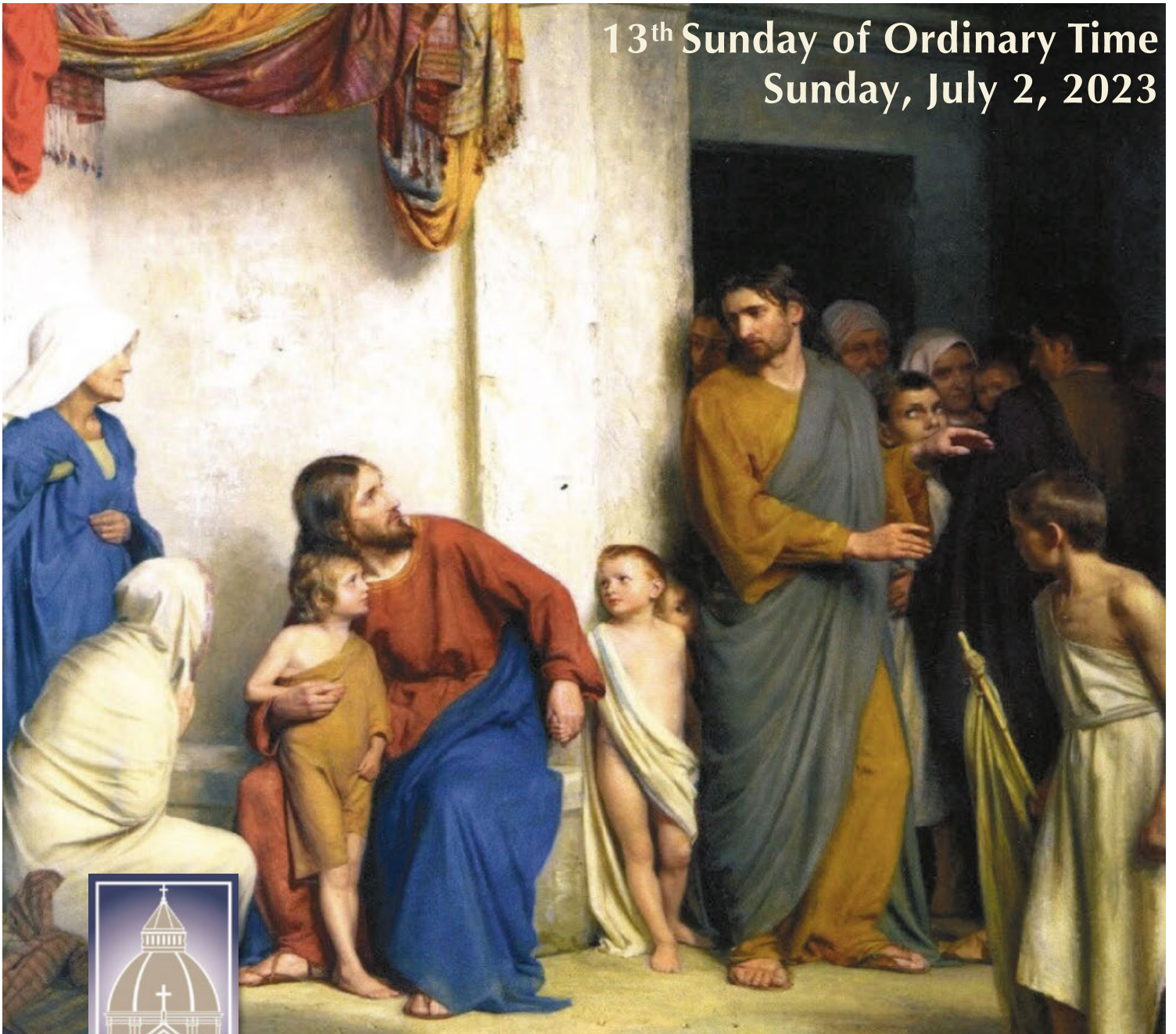

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's readings take us back to some basics of stewardship living and demonstrate the genius of this way of life.

Our First Reading, from 2 Kings, shows us the necessity and power of hospitality. It recounts the story of a woman who showed loving hospitality to a visitor, inviting him to dinner with her family and arranging a room for him in their home so that he would have a comfortable place to stay during his travels through her town. She reached out to the man in a simple and practical manner to make him feel welcome and was rewarded in an extraordinary way.

In our Second Reading, from the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds us of the power of our Baptism and how this sacrament makes us disciples. What does that mean for us here and now? St. Paul tells us very clearly: "You must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus." We must live for Christ! Nothing less will do.

Our Lord proclaims this same instruction in a rather shocking way in our Gospel passage from Matthew: "Whoever finds his life [by living for oneself] will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." But how do we lose our life? Precisely through loving actions towards others, loving them as if they were Christ. "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple... he will surely not lose his reward."

The simple brilliance of stewardship living — only our infinitely creative and compassionate God could conceive it!

REFLEXIÓN DE MAYORDOMÍA



Las lecturas de hoy nos llevan de vuelta a algunos conceptos básicos de la vida de mayordomía y demuestran el genio de esta forma de vida.

Nuestra primera lectura, de 2 Reyes, nos muestra la necesidad y el poder de la hospitalidad. Cuenta la historia de una mujer que mostró amorosa hospitalidad a un visitante, invitándolo a cenar con su familia y organizando una habitación para él en su casa para que tuviera un lugar cómodo para quedarse durante sus viajes por su ciudad. Ella se acercó al hombre de una manera simple y práctica para que se sintiera bienvenido y fue recompensada de una manera extraordinaria.

En nuestra segunda lectura, de la Carta a los Romanos, San Pablo nos recuerda el poder de nuestro Bautismo y cómo este sacramento nos hace discípulos. ¿Qué significa eso para nosotros aquí y ahora? San Pablo nos dice muy claramente: "Debéis pensar en vosotros mismos como muertos al pecado y viviendo para Dios en Cristo Jesús". ¡Debemos vivir para Cristo! Nada menos servirá.

Nuestro Señor proclama esta misma instrucción de una manera bastante impactante en nuestro pasaje evangélico de Mateo: "El que encuentra su vida [viviendo para sí mismo] la perderá, y el que pierde su vida por causa de mí la encontrará". Pero, ¿cómo perdemos nuestra vida? Precisamente a través de acciones amorosas hacia los demás, amándolos como si fueran Cristo. "Quien le da solo un vaso de agua fría a uno de estos pequeños para que beba porque el pequeño es un discípulo ... Seguramente no perderá su recompensa".

La simple brillantez de la vida de mayordomía: ¡solo nuestro Dios infinitamente creativo y compasivo podría concebirla!

Formation: Liturgy of the Word

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READING 1

2 KINGS 4:8-11, 14-16A

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

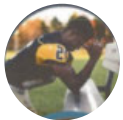

Lectio Divina Steps to Reading God's Word

- ◆ **Reading (lectio)** -listen to God's Word as it is read out loud. Ask: *"What does the Biblical text say?"*
- ◆ **Meditation (meditatio)** - reflect on the meaning of the text you heard. Ask: *"What is God saying to me in this text?"*
- ◆ **Prayer (oratio)** - speak with God in praise, thanksgiving, contrition and petition. Ask: *"What is my response to God in His Word?"*
- ◆ **Contemplation (contemplation)** -listen to God more quietly in the silence of the heart. Ask: *"How does the text make you feel in your relationship with God?"*
- ◆ **Action (action)** - put what you heard into action in your life. Ask: *"How will I change what I do today in response to hearing"*

Gospel Focus:

The conditions of discipleship outlined in Matthew's Gospel may appear harsh. Yet they underline for us a truth—choosing anything with one's whole heart has consequences. Choosing life with Christ means that every relationship we have must be understood from a new perspective. For many in Matthew's community, this choice brought division to their family.

With your Family

Jesus speaks of the qualities of a Discipleship. Make two Lists:
 1) What a Disciple is
 2) What a Disciple is not

Go through the Gospel and discuss the qualities they find for / against discipleship.

Which qualities do you see in the members of your family? Which qualities do you hope grow in your family?

With young kids, draw 'bricks', one for each member of your family. Have them put their name on their 'stone'. Use the stones to build a structure.

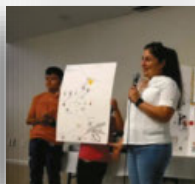

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥 79 (Mark 谷 9:30-37)

Many people hope that the time will stop at their most beautiful moment and for this reason; people have been searching for all kinds of means to keep them from aging, forever. Jesus provides us the best by saying, "Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me." When we encounter the everlasting and the most beautiful God with love, we will be like what God is. To start off, we have to learn from receiving the child and serving the needy with a humble heart.

Jesus emphasized that people who serve humbly are the greatest. That is to say, it lies in the ability to see and respond to the needs of others and it presupposes mercy, empathy, and sympathy. The two conditions of true greatness, therefore, are humility and service. Whenever the members of the church have ignored the call to service, the church has suffered, not from religious persecution, but the fall of spirituality.

Jesus said, "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." The term "servant" (diakonos) refers to a waiter and here, it means a servant to serve the king. Jesus pointed to his life and death in the spirit of his being a servant and being considered the last. In Jesus' heart, all people, including the sinful, are like his master or king for him to serve: "even as the Son of man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matt 20:28)

Jesus' cross event demonstrates to his disciples how to substitute for their ambition to rule with the intention to serve. We are all to be serving because true greatness lies in being the servant of all. Jesus, by concretely setting a child before them, asked his disciples to receive the child, suggesting the importance of innocence and humility in order to reveal what true servant is. By introducing the example of a child, Jesus also showed us that, when serving others, we must be careful to serve the least important because, in humans' eyes, the crucified Jesus is among the least.

首先，以謙卑的心接納孩子和為有需要的人服務

耶穌強調謙卑服務的人最偉大，也就是在於能夠看到並以慈悲憐憫回應。因此，耶穌眼中真正偉大的兩個條件，是謙卑和服務。每當基督徒忽視服務這個聖召時，教會就遭受痛苦，不是宗教迫害，而是神修墮落。

耶穌說：“誰若想做第一個，他就得做眾人中最末的一個，並要做眾人的僕役。”“僕役”（diakonos）一詞指的是伺候者，這裡指侍奉國王的僕人。耶穌以他作為僕人的精神，活出他的生與死，這是天主為人做的最謙卑的偉大工作。耶穌心中，所有人，包括罪人，都像他的主人或君王，他以死亡復活來伺候：“就如人子來不是受服事，而是服事人，並交出自己的生命，為大眾作贖價。”（瑪20:28）

耶穌的十字架事件向門徒展示如何用服務代替統治野心；因為天國裡面真正偉大的，在於成為所有人的僕人。

耶穌具體把一個小孩放在門徒面前，要他們收留這個孩子，說明純真和謙卑的重要，好能揭示真正僕人的意義。同時，耶穌也藉著收留小孩這行動來告訴門徒，在服務時，要找那些毫不起眼的，因為在罪人眼裡，被釘十字架的耶穌，也是最受輕視的。

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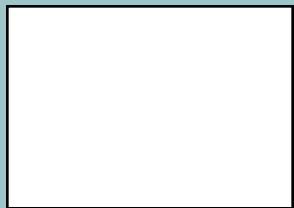


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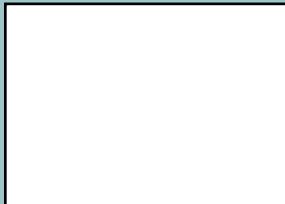
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
