## Stewardship Reflection

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of our Lord. The Gospel account of the three magi traveling to meet Baby Jesus is one that we know well. Yet, when we pause to reflect on this moment when these men met Christ for the first time, we recognize that there is much to be said for us still today.

When the magi entered the house, it says, "they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Clearly these men knew that they were in the presence of their King. They also came bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, which symbolize Christ's kingship, divinity, and humanity.

Christ is still manifesting Himself to us today. We enter God's house weekly, and we are in His presence. When we meet Him, do we offer Him our gifts — our time, talent, and treasure? As Christian stewards, we are called to respond with love, reverence, and gratitude.

Let us prepare our hearts to receive Christ's many manifestations in our lives. We just need a grateful disposition to receive them.

### Epiphany Proclamation

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25. In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday, the upcoming dates were "proclaimed" after the gospel in this way:

*Know dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the fourteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the thirty-first day of March, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twelfth day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ. On the nineteenth day of May, the feast of Pentecost. On the second day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the first day of December, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen*

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## READING 1

### IS 60:1-6

## GOSPEL

Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*" Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." Al ver de nuevo la estrella, se llenaron de inmensa alegría. Entraron en la casa y vieron al niño con María, su madre, y postrándose, lo adoraron. Después, abriendo sus cofres, le ofrecieron regalos: oro, incienso y mirra. Advertidos durante el sueño de que no volvieran a Herodes, regresaron a su tierra por otro camino.

## Prayer: Breaking Open the Word Mass Preparation for Sunday, JAN 14

### Preparar: 2do Domingo de Tiempo Ordinary

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19  
Ps 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10  
1 Cor 6:13c-15a, 17-20  
Jn 1:35-42

### Enfoque del evangelio:

El próximo domingo es el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario y el tema de las lecturas es "ser llamado". En la primera lectura vemos al joven Samuel siendo llamado por Dios tres veces, y en la tercera vez él responde: "Habla Señor, tu siervo escucha". En el Evangelio Jesús llama a Simón con un nuevo nombre: "Cefas", que puede traducirse como Petros o Pedro. Nuestros nombres son importantes, y cuando nos llaman por nuestro nombre, casi nos vemos obligados a responder.

### Con tu familia

- ◆ *Lea Juan 1:35-42*
- ◆ *¿Qué nombre le da Jesús a Simón? El nuevo nombre de Simón se traduce "Pedro", que significa: Roca (sobre esta roca edificaré mi Iglesia. Mira tus nombres de pila. Pregúntales a tus padres por qué te llamaron así. ¿Te llamaron así en honor a un santo, un pariente o persona inspiradora?*
- ◆ *Busca tu nombre. ¿Qué significa? Pídele al Señor que te muestre cómo tu nombre está conectado con tu llamado.*
- ◆ *Si Jesús te llamara y cambiara tu nombre, ¿cómo te llamaría?*

### Gospel Focus:

Next Sunday is the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time and the theme in the readings is "being called". In the first reading we watch young Samuel being called by God three times, and on the third time he responds, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening." In the Gospel Jesus calls Simon by a new name: "Cephas", which can be translated as Petros, or Peter. Our names are important, and when we are called by name, we are almost compelled to respond.

### With your Family

- ◆ *Read John 1:35-42*
- ◆ *What name does Jesus give Simon? Simon's new name is translated "Peter", which means—Rock (on this rock I will build my Church. Look at your given names. Ask your parents why you were named what you were. Were you named after a saint, a relative or inspiring person?*
- ◆ *Look up your name. What does it mean? Ask the Lord to show you how your name is connected with your calling.*
- ◆ *If Jesus were to call you and change your name, what might He name you?*

### January / Enero —Week 2

The second week of the month our focus is how God the Father cares for us and how the Holy Spirit moves us to prayer.

### The Holy Spirit—The Source of Prayer

Jesus said that no one can enter the Kingdom of God without first being born of water and the Spirit. We all received the Holy Spirit at Baptism, and the life of the Spirit continues to grow through prayer and the Sacraments. It is only because of the Holy Spirit living within us that we can respond to the Father's call. The Holy Spirit transforms our hearts so that we can be open to the Father's love, and He moves us to have a conversation with God, which is the life of prayer.

Only through the Holy Spirit can we know Jesus. Just as the Holy Spirit dwelled in Mary when she conceived Jesus in her womb, so must He dwell within us if we are to hold Jesus in our hearts. We should pray to the Holy Spirit before we receive each of the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist, so that our souls are purified and ready to receive the grace of the Sacrament and the presence of Jesus.

*Come Holy Spirit, fill our hearts with the fire of Your Divine Love.*

### El Espíritu Santo: La Fuente de la Oración

Jesús dijo que nadie puede entrar al Reino de Dios sin antes nacer del agua y del Espíritu. Todos recibimos el Espíritu Santo en el Bautismo y la vida del Espíritu continúa creciendo a través de la oración y los Sacramentos. Sólo a través del Espíritu Santo podemos conocer a Jesús. Así como el Espíritu Santo habitó en María cuando concibió a Jesús en su vientre, así debe morar dentro de nosotros si queremos tener a Jesús en nuestros corazones. Debemos orar al Espíritu Santo antes de recibir cada uno de los Sacramentos, particularmente la Eucaristía, para que nuestras almas queden purificadas y listas para recibir la gracia del Sacramento y la presencia de Jesús.

## A Glimpse of Spirituality 瞬間靈修 106 (Luke 16:9-15)

Some Christians are part-time followers of Jesus. They put God at the bottom of their checking list; however, it is God who provides everything for them. They drink the water but simply ignore the source. They try everything to please or better said; to satisfy their material desires but with respect to spirituality, they just forget that it makes a person a human. In other words, when they worship mammon, their “god” is the devil and finally, they are not people with human dignity at all.

Regarding the service to one master, the master had exclusive possession of his slave in the Greco-Roman world. A slave had no spare time of his own since every ounce of his energy belonged to his master. In this saying, Jesus reminded us that, like slaves, we cannot serve God on a part-time basis. Once a person chooses to serve God, every moment belongs to God. As Christians, we are called to serve God first.

Jesus said, “No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other .... You cannot serve God and mammon.” The verb “serve” (douleuein) refers to slaves who obey the masters’ commands and render to them the services due. That is to say, they have to say “yes” to every order of the masters. God’s will is always good for people. Thus, following God’s will as the first priority is not blind obedience but for the eternal life of Christians.

This parable challenges us to stride into the future with faith; not in ourselves or our abilities, not even our bank accounts but in the grace of God. It is because our lives come from the merciful love of God so that our goal of life should be God not mammon. Wrong direction of life leads people to the devil even if there are tons of beautiful roses on the way to hell.

有些基督徒只是兼職耶穌門徒；他們只把天主放在生命清單最後一項；然而，為他們提供一切的，是主。可以說，他們沒有飲水思源，只是想盡辦法取悅自己；或更好說是滿足物質慾望；神修方面，忘記他們只是活著像人，甚至不知道自己是人。換言之，當崇拜錢財時，他們的“神”就是魔鬼，最後淪為沒有尊嚴魔鬼爪牙。

關於忠誠侍主，在希臘羅馬世界，主人對奴隸擁有一切生殺之權，奴隸沒有自己私人空間與時間，因為生命權都歸主人。

耶穌提醒，不能像奴隸一樣服事錢財，對天主卻是兼職。他說：“沒有一個家僕能事奉兩個主人的：他或是要恨這一個而愛那一個，或是要依附這一個而輕忽那一個：你們不能事奉天主而又事奉錢財。”

動詞“事奉”(douleuein)解作奴隸服從主人命令，為主人提供應有服務；也就是說，必須對每一道命令說“是”。天主旨意永遠是對人有好處，因此，遵行主旨是第一要務，不是盲從命令，而是為了永生。

比喻挑戰基督徒憑著信德邁向未來；不是單靠自己能力，甚至不是銀行帳戶，而是靠天主恩寵。人的生命來自天主慈悲大愛，所以人生目標應是主，非錢。

錯誤人生方向導人走向魔鬼，即使通往地獄路上，有無數美麗玫瑰勾引。
