Reflections and Readings

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Stewardship Reflection



The readings on this fifth Sunday of Easter present us with themes of dwelling places and home. As Christian stewards, we are well aware that this world is not our permanent home. We are merely pilgrims here, making our way through the stewardship way of life to our true home, heaven.

Yet, as we make our way to heaven, we are called to make our dwelling here — whether we are in a household of one or bursting at the seams — a true “domestic church.” In other words, the stewardship way of life begins long before we set foot on the parish grounds. Stewardship starts at home. It begins with our families — our domestic churches.

The domestic church plays a key role in our sanctification because it is the primary place where we practice intimate and selfless love of other persons.

In our Gospel passage from John, Jesus speaks of heaven as a home filled with dwelling places. “In my Father’s house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you?” This is a beautiful image of the glory that awaits us and the personal love our Lord has for us in preparing the perfect “spot” for each one of us who remain faithful to Him.

Let us respond to this great love by becoming good stewards of our earthly dwellings, making our homes true “domestic churches” where we honor God with our prayer, our thoughtfulness to each other, and our generous hospitality to all.

Let us never forget that stewardship starts at home!

Liturgy and Music Corner

What was up with the Intercessions at Lent?

Last week, I briefly answered a question I received from several parishioners: why have we been singing a Hymn of Praise?

Another question I have been asked is why the congregation did not have a sung/spoken response to the Universal Prayer (i.e., Intercessions/Petitions) during Lent. My response will be the same as last week: because the Church gives us this option.

A few years ago, I had the pleasure of attending Mass at a Benedictine monastery in the Midwest. At the Universal Prayer, the Sister who read the intercessions proclaimed them in this way.

“We pray for our Church.” (silent pause of over a minute)

“We pray for our Pope.” (another silent, extended pause)

“We pray for our beloved dead.” (silence)

At first, I was confused as I had never experienced the Universal Prayer proclaimed with brief invocations followed by lengthy silence. So, after Mass, I had to Google the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) to see if this was an option. This is what I found:

The intentions “are announced from the ambo or from another suitable place, by the Deacon or by a cantor, a reader, or one of the lay faithful. The people, for their part, stand and give expression to their prayer either by an invocation said in common after each intention or by praying in silence” (GIRM para. 71).

The next time I attended liturgy at this monastery, I was not confused during the Universal Prayer. The brief intercessions followed by the extended silence allowed me to internalize the Universal Prayer like I had never done before. My focus was not distracted by long intercessions or a communal response. It became a powerful, personal moment in the Mass, and I was deeply moved.

In consultation with Father O'Reilly and the Liturgy Committee, we implemented the option of “praying in silence” in Lent 2022.




Can Catholics Gamble?

Question: The Bible says that Jesus condemned gambling, but I notice that so many parishes have them at festivals and other events. What's correct?

Answer: Although Jesus speaks of our relationship with material wealth and the very human struggle with greed, the gospels do not include any specific instructions related to gambling. At the same time, the Church is very sensitive to the needs of those who might struggle with an addiction to gambling, and pastoral care should always be offered to those who struggle with this reality in their life.

While it is true that many parish or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette, ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong these sorts of events, given they are played fairly and within the limits of reason are not morally objectionable. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" (no. 2413).

As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs.




The Scarlet and the Black



Jesus is the Way to Heaven

In today's Gospel reading Jesus tells the disciples that He is the way to the Father in Heaven.

Jesus is the way for us to go to Heaven. But how can a person be a way to get somewhere? Jesus is always with the Father in Heaven, so the closer we are to Jesus the closer we are to Heaven!

How can we be close to Jesus? Here are some ways:

Saint Magdalene of Canossa was born in 1774 into a good noble family. She loved learning about God and helped her brother and her sisters at home with their catechism studies—what we call “faith formation” today. It is from the years of her youth that he began to think about building a “culture of more”, not the way our society seeks to acquire external goods, but rather of “being more, giving more, daring more”, in humility and charity. Today, her message is resonating with many young people. Let’s look at the first point:

TO BE MORE: this way allows oneself to be challenged by the Gospel ... not content with half measures or acquiring a weak personality that remains in the “we will see”; every young person who builds his or her house on the Rock is a person compelled to dream of a life that is more than what the world can promise, and is fascinated to entertain this reality.

Santa Magdalena de Canossa nació en 1774 en el seno de una buena familia noble. Le encantaba aprender sobre Dios y ayudaba a su hermano ya sus hermanas en casa con sus estudios de catecismo, lo que hoy llamamos “formación en la fe”. Es desde los años de su juventud que comienza a pensar en construir una “cultura del más”, no como nuestra sociedad busca adquirir bienes externos, sino en “ser más, dar más, arriesgar más”, en la humildad y caridad. Hoy, su mensaje está resonando entre muchos jóvenes. Veamos el primer punto:

SER MÁS: así esse deja interpelar por el Evangelio... no contentarse con medias tintas ni con adquirir una personalidad débil que se queda en el “veremos”; todo joven que construye su casa sobre la Roca es una persona compelida a soñar con una vida que es más de lo que el mundo puede prometer, y está fascinada de entretenerse con esta realidad.

On May 8th the Canossian Sisters celebrate their Institute’s high feast of their Foundress, Saint Magdalene of Canossa. The Cathedral has been blessed to have her Daughters of Charity serve our Community. A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥72 (Luke路 2:22-40)

In some developed countries, there is an abundance of food; however, there is often a famine of the heart due to a lack of love. The victims of this famine of love are the new poor. Who are they? Why is there a famine of love in developed countries, even someone who sits next to us in our families? The answer is simple: self-centeredness.

This self-centeredness has become a new idol of people that even though Christians are unavoidably included. Jesus gave us the solution to self-centeredness, i.e. he made us a new family by his incarnation. In this family, everyone is equal as sisters and brothers since he called us his friends (John 15:15). Jesus' parents observed the laws regarding circumcision, purification, and presentation of the first born as dedicated to the Lord. In fact, many Jewish people were only religious, not spiritual; so do the Christians. Thus, transforming self-centered people to live together as a family is difficult in this imperfect world.

Jesus is not a popular idol but a sign of contradiction. His ministry shows us that even he wanted to bring the scattered into God's family, some still rejected his invitation because for them, Jesus was simply a figure to be opposed.

Because of people's self-centeredness, Simeon already knew that although Jesus was God's hope, not everyone would respond positively to him. He said to Mary the mother of Jesus, "Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is spoken against." The passive verb "is set" (keitai) can be interpreted metaphorically as the appointment of God's intention. In other words, God practices justice through Jesus who brings the world salvific grace. Jesus is not a divider, his opponents are. They are those who refuse to receive God's justice.

The purpose of Jesus' ministry that divides is so that the thoughts of the hearts might be made manifest. The way the humans respond to Jesus reveals their true colors. Jesus comes, humans choose. Some oppose him and fall. Indeed, whoever accepts Jesus is accepted into God's family, a new family of faith.

有些發達國家，人民豐衣足食；然而，由於缺愛，往往造成心靈飢荒。愛的飢荒受害者是新品種的窮人；是誰？為什麼在發達國家出現愛的飢荒？答案簡單：自我中心。

“自我中心”已經成為人的新偶像，即使基督徒也不可避免被包括在內。耶穌給了我們解決自我中心的方法，即他以降生成人所建立的新家。在這家，每人都是兄弟姐妹一樣平等，因為耶穌稱我們為朋友（若15:15）。

耶穌父母是虔誠猶太人，遵守所有梅瑟法律，包括割禮、取潔禮以及獻長子給天主。事實上，許多猶太人只是墨守成規守法，而沒神修，甚至有些基督徒也是如此。因此，在這不完美的世界，很難將自我中心的人轉化為共融互愛的家人。

耶穌不是普受歡迎的偶像，而是世界反對的記號。即使他的牧職要將分散的人帶入天主的家，依然有人拒絕，對他們來說，耶穌只是被敵對的人物。

因著人的自我中心，西默盎已經知道耶穌雖然是天主送給世界的永生希望，但並不是每個人都正面回應；他對耶穌母親瑪利亞說：“看，這孩子已被立定，為使以色列中許多人跌倒和復起，並成為反對的記號。”被動語態動詞“被立定”（keitai）比作天主旨意的派遣；換言之，天主通過耶穌給世界帶來救恩，這是天主的正義。耶穌不是分裂者，他的敵對者才是；就是那些拒絕天主正義的人。

耶穌的牧職，帶來人們分裂，因為耶穌降生成人居我人間，他的臨在讓人的心思都顯露出來；人對耶穌的不同回應，揭示他們真相。

耶穌來，人選擇。有人因敵對他而跌倒；可是，誰接受耶穌，就被接入天主的家。

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
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
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
