



3rd Sunday of Lent Gospel Reflection God Satisfies our Thirst

Sunday's Gospel shows how Jesus' mission for all of us works. Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. He tells her about a different kind of water that he offers: A living water that makes life eternal with God. The woman sees that he is the promised Messiah and immediately evangelizes the local villagers. They too come to accept who Jesus is after listening to him teach for two days. Like Jesus, we share his Good News and invite others to "drink" the living water from God.


- **Read** [John 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42](#)





The Scrutinies: A Way of Spiritual Purification and Strengthening

In Catholic tradition, the Scrutinies are special rites of prayer and reflection celebrated for those preparing for Baptism at the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), especially during Lent.

What are the Scrutinies?

The Scrutinies are three sacred rites celebrated on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent. They are meant to help the Elect (those preparing for Baptism at Easter) undergo spiritual purification and strengthening.

The word “scrutiny” here means *allowing God to search and heal the heart*. It is not about judgment by others, but about God’s loving examination that leads to healing and freedom.

What do the Scrutinies do?

- * **Reveal** what is weak or sinful in the heart
- * **Strengthen** what is good and holy
- * **Free** the person from the power of sin and evil
- * **Prepare** Elect for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- * **Deepen** conversion and trust in Christ

Even though the Scrutinies are for the Elect, they also invite **all of us present to examine our own hearts** and grow in conversion during Lent.

Want to become Catholic?

For those seeking Christ and the Sacraments in the Catholic Church.

For those not baptized who are seeking faith and meaning.

For those baptized in the Catholic or other Christian tradition but did not receive Confirmation and Eucharist.



Each Scrutiny is connected to a powerful reading from the Gospel of Saint John:

- **3rd Sunday of Lent:**
Woman at the Well (John 4)
Jesus as Living Water
- **4th Sunday of Lent:**
The Man Born Blind (John 9)
Jesus as Light of the World
- **5th Sunday of Lent:**
The Raising of Lazarus (Jn 11)
Jesus the Resurrection & Life

These three themes help us ‘scrutinize’ the human condition and reflect on how Jesus leads us from thirst to fulfillment; blindness to sight; and death to new life.

The story of the Woman at the Well in the Gospel of John (John 4:5–42), Jesus reveals Himself as the source of “living water,” inviting the woman to move from spiritual thirst to faith. This encounter reflects the journey of the Elect, who are called to recognize their own longing for God and to open their hearts to Christ’s healing grace. Through the prayers of the First Scrutiny, the Church asks that they be purified, strengthened, and prepared to receive the new life of Baptism, where Christ will fill them with the living water of salvation.



When the Samaritan Woman realizes the truth of who Jesus is, she abandons her water jar and runs to tell the others of the Christ.

Ask yourself:

- * "What obstacles hold you back from responding to God's gift of faith? In what way are you being invited to surrender to deeper - life quenching - relationship with Jesus?"
- * What areas of my life feel dry, tired, or in need of God's healing grace?
- * What are the “wells” I return to that do not fully satisfy my deepest needs?
- * Like the woman, I am called to grow in faith. What steps am I being invited to take toward Christ now?

2026 Rotary/Cathedral Crab Feed A Success!

On February 7, the Rotary Club of South Sacramento partnered with the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament Social Services to host a Crab Feed and Silent Auction at the Scottish Rites Hall in East Sacramento. It was the second consecutive year the Cathedral partnered with Rotary for the annual Crab Feed. Approximately 420 guests attended, including approximately 90 people from the Cathedral Parish Community.

While all the expenses have not yet been accounted for, a preliminary estimate is that the event raised between \$12 thousand and \$14 thousand for the Cathedral's Social Services programs! A final tally will be available in the next several weeks, and a check will be presented to the Cathedral once the accounting is finalized.

A huge thank you to everyone who volunteered to help, attended the event, contributed valuable gifts to the silent auction, and to those who bid generously on them. Special thanks to Susan Moeller for the many beautiful baskets she created, the Knights of Columbus for their hard work in the Kitchen and behind the bar, and the St. Vincent DePaul Society for their assistance with setup, cleanup and work during the event.

¡Éxito del evento Rotary/ Cathedral Crab Feed 2026!

El 7 de febrero, el Club Rotario de South Sacramento se asoció con los Servicios Sociales de la Catedral del Santísimo Sacramento para organizar un evento Crab Feed y una subasta silenciosa en el Scottish Rites Hall, en East Sacramento. Era el segundo año consecutivo que la Catedral se asociaba con Rotary para celebrar el evento anual Crab Feed. Aproximadamente 420 invitados asistieron al evento, entre ellos unas 90 personas de la comunidad parroquial de la catedral.

Aunque aún no se han contabilizado todos los gastos, la estimación preliminar es que el evento recaudó entre 12 000 y 14 000 dólares para los programas de servicios sociales de la catedral. El recuento final estará disponible en las próximas semanas y se entregará un cheque a la catedral una vez que se haya finalizado la contabilidad.

“No Prayer Ever Goes Unanswered”

An acquaintance once asked me why Catholics spend so much time praying. He pointed out prayers being said for people obviously too sick to ever recover, prayers after major disasters, requests for things that never come. “And then look what happens anyway,” he finished, “the sick people die, others are killed, crime continues, and we never get what we really want.”

Non-believers like this man and, sadly, even some of us look upon prayer this way, as something like magic that we use when we want something. Up goes the prayer, fingers crossed, and down comes the exact answer we want. But what if nothing happens, or if the opposite of what we requested shows up instead?

Yes, people die, we all will. Horrible things continue to happen everywhere, some right here in our city. And we don't always get just what we want, or think we need. But we continue to pray, always. Because as Catholics we know and trust that God does hear and answer us. The answer might not be what we sought or expected, but an answer comes, regardless.

I read recently about “stored prayers” that Our Lord holds onto, sometimes for a very long time. He never forgets any of them. But He knows best when and how to answer. He stores our prayers until the best time and in the best possible way to benefit our spiritual growth and well-being. He knows best. I've experienced this myself, many times, and in some strange but ultimately fulfilling ways.

When we pray, God's gentle hand is guiding us. Sometimes it takes years before we hear God's answer. But we must never give up.

More than ever right now, our prayers are needed, for so many reasons. We are tempted to give up. But we keep on, we keep praying and trusting and asking God to help us and all our loved ones, and then we wait to see His decision whenever and however it comes.

Those trapped in the darkness of a life without faith need our prayers. Our state and our city and our country need prayers, desperately. Our sick and the homeless on our streets and even on our Cathedral steps need them. Our families and our children need our prayers.

As we continue on our Lenten journey let us all commit to keep on praying, harder than ever. Never give up! Never forget that the One who loves us the most hears and answers every prayer.

Un conocido me preguntó una vez por qué los católicos dedican tanto tiempo a rezar. Pero seguimos rezando, siempre. Porque como católicos sabemos y confiamos en que Dios nos escucha y nos responde. Puede que la respuesta no sea la que buscábamos o esperábamos, pero la respuesta llega, independientemente de ello.

Hace poco leí sobre las «oraciones almacenadas» que Nuestro Señor guarda, a veces durante mucho tiempo. Él nunca olvida ninguna de ellas. Pero Él sabe mejor cuándo y cómo responder. Guarda nuestras oraciones hasta el mejor momento y de la mejor manera posible para beneficiar nuestro crecimiento espiritual y nuestro bienestar. Él sabe lo que es mejor. Yo misma lo he experimentado muchas veces, de formas extrañas pero, en última instancia, satisfactorias.

Cuando rezamos, la mano bondadosa de Dios nos guía. A veces pasan años antes de que escuchemos la respuesta de Dios. Pero nunca debemos rendirnos.

Ahora más que nunca, nuestras oraciones son necesarias, por muchas razones. Nos sentimos tentados a rendirnos. Pero seguimos adelante, seguimos rezando y confiando y pidiendo a Dios que nos ayude a nosotros y a todos nuestros seres queridos, y luego esperamos a ver Su decisión, cuando y como sea que llegue.

Los que están atrapados en la oscuridad de una vida sin fe necesitan nuestras oraciones. Nuestro estado, nuestra ciudad y nuestro país necesitan oraciones, desesperadamente. Nuestros enfermos y las personas sin hogar en nuestras calles e incluso en las escaleras de nuestra catedral las necesitan. Nuestras familias y nuestros hijos necesitan nuestras oraciones.
