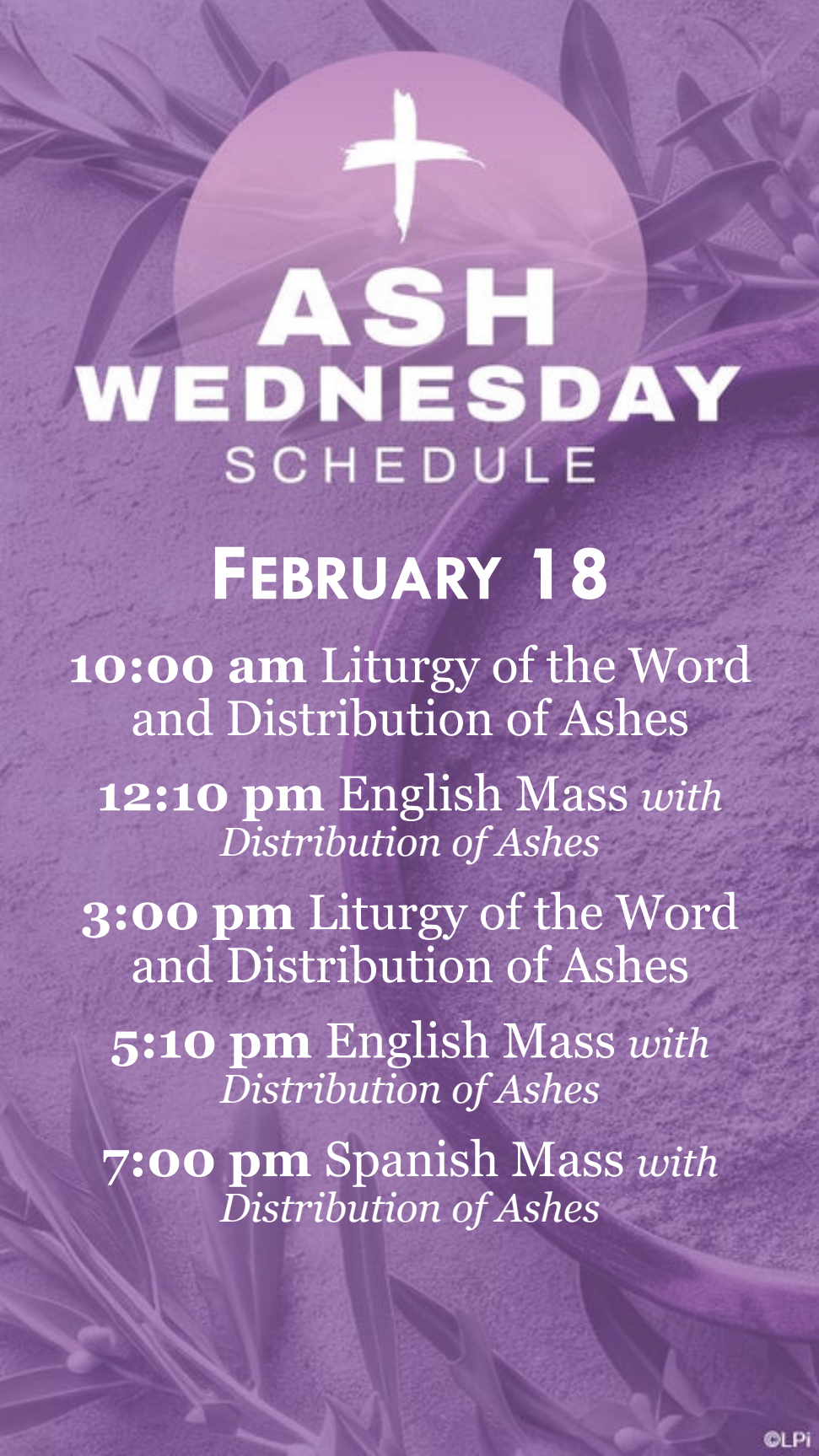

Faith Formation & Evangelization

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Gospel Reflection Living God's Law with Love

This Sunday reminds us that God's law is meant to lead us to **true happiness**. In the readings, we hear that good choices bring life and draw us closer to God, while poor choices can lead us away from Him. Jesus invites us to go beyond simply following rules. He calls us to live with **honesty, kindness, and self-control**, choosing what is good from the heart. When we understand God's moral law, we are better able to make loving choices and live as true followers of Christ. As we prepare for **Lent** (Ash Wednesday is February 18), let us reflect on the **Ten Commandments** as a guide for living the way God designed us to live—a way that leads to real joy and happiness.



Family Moment:

- **The first three Commandments** teach us about the love we owe to God. *How are you showing God that you love Him in your daily life?*
- **The last seven Commandments** guide us in loving our neighbor. *How do we show honesty, kindness, and respect to others each day?*



6º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario Reflexión sobre el Evangelio Vivir la ley de Dios con amor

Este domingo nos recuerda que la ley de Dios tiene como objetivo guiarnos hacia la **verdadera felicidad**. En las lecturas, escuchamos que las buenas decisiones nos dan vida y nos acercan a Dios, mientras que las malas decisiones pueden alejarnos de Él. Jesús nos invita a ir más allá del simple cumplimiento de las normas. Nos llama a vivir con **honestidad, bondad y autocontrol**, eligiendo lo que es bueno desde el corazón. Cuando comprendemos la ley moral de Dios, somos más capaces de tomar decisiones amorosas y vivir como verdaderos seguidores de Cristo. Mientras nos preparamos para la **Cuaresma** (el Miércoles de Ceniza es el 18 de febrero), reflexionemos sobre los **Diez Mandamientos** como guía para vivir de la manera en que Dios nos diseñó para vivir, una manera que nos lleva a la verdadera alegría y felicidad.

Momento de fe en familia:

- **Los tres primeros mandamientos** nos enseñan sobre el amor que le debemos a Dios. *¿Cómo le demuestras a Dios que lo amas en tu vida diaria?*
- **Los últimos siete mandamientos** nos guían en el amor al prójimo. *¿Cómo demostramos honestidad, amabilidad y respeto hacia los demás cada día?*

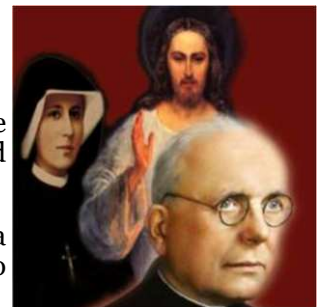


Saint of the Week | Santo de la Semana

Blessed Fr. Michael Sopocko—A priest “fully filled with God”

Most known as the Spiritual Director of Saint Faustina Kowalska, assisting her to make sense of the visions she had of Jesus as the Divine Mercy. He believed Faustina when no one else did, and promoted the Divine Mercy devotion until his death on February 15, 1975.

Family Faith Formation and OCIA—Formation of Faith and of Sacraments for Children and Adults

Formación en la Fe y Evangelización

Mass Preparation Sunday, February 22, 2026

1st Sunday of Lent
Summary of the Readings:

- **First Reading:** *Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7:* God formed man and placed him in Eden. The serpent deceived the woman into eating the forbidden fruit. She and her husband ate it and realized they were naked.
- **Responsorial Psalm:** *Psalm 51:* Lord, have mercy and cleanse us from our sins. Create a clean heart and renew our spirits. Restore our joy and open our lips to praise you.
- **Second Reading:** *Romans 5:12-19:* One man's sin brought death to all, but God's grace through Jesus brings life and righteousness to many. Christ's obedience will make many righteous.
- **Gospel:** *Matthew 4:1-11:* Jesus was tempted by the devil after fasting in the desert. He resisted, quoting Scripture each time. Afterward, the devil left, and angels cared for him.

Reflect:

In next Sunday's Gospel, Jesus chooses not to turn stones to bread, jump off high buildings, or take worldly power. Jesus chose instead to share our humanity and its limitations, even death. He did this to call us to use our own godlike powers—loving others, forgiving one another, sharing what we have, and working to include everyone in our human family. The First Reading comes from Genesis 2 and 3, the story of God creating a human from the humus, the earth, and of the first human temptation and choice. This story tells us that humans learn good from evil through their experiences and through the law.

- *Lent is a time of taking a good look at how we live our lives and "turn back to God with all our heart. How is God calling your family closer this Lent?*
- *Lent is also a time to "give up" things that get in the way of growing close to God. What are you giving up this Lent?*



Preparación para la Misa Domingo, 22 de Febrero

I Domingo de la Cuaresema
Resumen de las lecturas:

- **Primera lectura:** Génesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7: Dios formó al hombre y lo colocó en el Edén. La serpiente engañó a la mujer para que comiera el fruto prohibido. Ella y su marido lo comieron y se dieron cuenta de que estaban desnudos.
- **Salmo responsorial:** Salmo 51: Señor, ten piedad y límpianos de nuestros pecados. Crea en nosotros un corazón limpio y renueva nuestro espíritu. Devuélvenos la alegría y abre nuestros labios para alabarte.
- **Segunda lectura:** Romanos 5, 12-19: El pecado de un solo hombre trajo la muerte a todos, pero la gracia de Dios por medio de Jesús trae vida y justicia a muchos. La obediencia de Cristo hará justos a muchos.
- **Evangelio:** Mateo 4, 1-11: Jesús fue tentado por el diablo después de ayunar en el desierto. Él resistió, citando las Escrituras cada vez. Después, el diablo se marchó y los ángeles lo cuidaron.

Reflejar:

En el Evangelio del próximo domingo, Jesús decide no convertir las piedras en pan, no saltar desde edificios altos ni tomar el poder mundano. En cambio, Jesús eligió compartir nuestra humanidad y sus limitaciones, incluso la muerte. Lo hizo para llamarnos a usar nuestros propios poderes divinos: amar a los demás, perdonarnos unos a otros, compartir lo que tenemos y trabajar para incluir a todos en nuestra familia humana. La primera lectura proviene de Génesis 2 y 3, la historia de Dios creando al ser humano a partir del humus, la tierra, y de la primera tentación y elección del ser humano. Esta historia nos dice que los seres humanos aprenden el bien del mal a través de sus experiencias y de la ley.

- *La Cuaresema es un tiempo para examinar detenidamente cómo vivimos nuestras vidas y «volvernos a Dios con todo nuestro corazón». ¿Cómo está llamando Dios a tu familia a acercarse más a Él en esta Cuaresema?*
- *La Cuaresema es también un tiempo para «renunciar» a las cosas que nos impiden acercarnos a Dios. ¿A qué vas a renunciar esta Cuaresema?*

Shuffling Ahead

He looked down at his shoes as he shuffled forward in line. They were great running shoes when they were new. "When was the last time I went on a run?" As a kid he liked to run. Indeed, he was pretty fast, but it must have been 40 years since he set out on a run of any substantial length. Yet, he kept buying running shoes. Mostly because they are comfortable and he liked the fashion statement they make. "Maybe I should go for a run today. What? Stop! No time for thinking about that now." He shuffled further forward.

"Concentrate on where you are." He wasn't as easily distracted now as before. Back then, he couldn't even finish an Our Father without a mundane thought intruding his prayer. What's for lunch? Did I close the garage door? Is it supposed to rain on Friday? Prayer was difficult when he first tried doing it in earnest. He remembered trying to stay focused by picturing images of each word in his mind. "OUR" in all-caps written on a highway billboard. "Father" posted on a cinema marquis. "Who" in a cartoon speech bubble coming from an owl. "aRt" graffitied in bright bold colors on a cinderblock wall. Reciting Our Fathers and Hail Marys took a lot longer then, but somehow his imagination and memory finally relented, allowing his mind and conscience to align and slip away into the ethereal elsewhere, albeit for however briefly. "C'mon now, you can do better than this." He shuffled further forward.

Doubt was never his problem with prayer. There was never a moment that he didn't believe in God, nor in the four last things: death, judgement, heaven and hell. His problem was he didn't take God seriously. He'd spent most of his life believing he'd be a shoo-in for heaven. He didn't baldly lie or boldly cheat. He hadn't committed adultery, or at least, that's what he used to believe. He certainly wasn't a killer. Even the little bugs in the house he'd cup in his hands and release outside. Sure, he stopped going to mass, but who hadn't? It took a calamity to shake him out of his complacency, but once it struck, he knew how far from God he'd strayed. He shuffled forward some more.

Death still scared him, although not nearly as much as before. But judgement, oh, he was much more concerned about that now. He thought he was good before when actually he was far from good. "What makes me sure I'm not doing the same thing now?" He'd become an avid bible reader. His prayer life was strong. He returned to Church, observed the sabbath,

frequented the sacraments, volunteered his time. But what if all those little sins, the ones he tried to let go but couldn't; the gossiping word, the wicked thought, the careless act; what if all those add up to be too much? "What if at my judgement Christ frowns on me?" He shuddered at the thought. He was near the front of the line.

He began praying by rote: "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Then his mind fixed on a new prayer: "Oh Jesus, when we meet after my death, please smile upon me." He arrived at the front of the line.

"The body of Christ," said the priest. "Amen," he replied.

Back in the pews, kneeling, while the Eucharistic host was still dissolving on his tongue, he jolted to attention. "Oh Lord, I don't know if you just smiled on me or not, but now I know every time I receive you in the Eucharist, it's a trial run for when we meet at my death."

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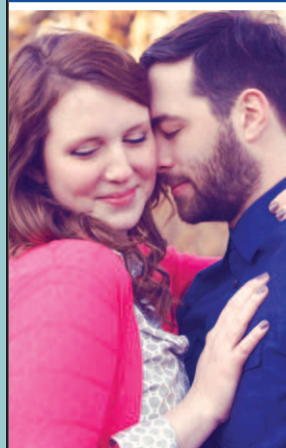
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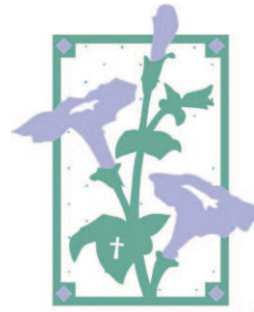
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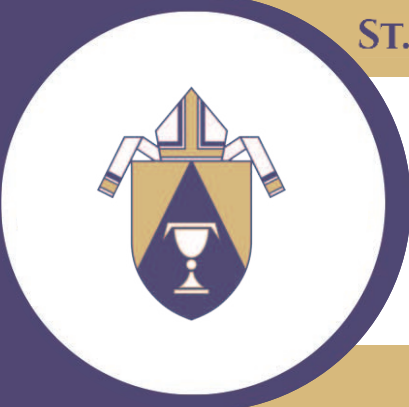
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
