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STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



In our Gospel today we hear the story of a man who ran up to Jesus and asked Him what he must do to reach eternal life.

Jesus said, “You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.”

It says the man went away sad because he had much.

We might cringe when we hear this story because it is sad — this man was so close to becoming an active disciple of Jesus, but instead turned away. We also might cringe because it could be deeply applicable to our lives.

Jesus states that “It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.”

One of the metaphors for the “eye of a needle” was a tight passageway into Jerusalem that people had to enter to get into the city. In order for their camels to pass through, they had to remove whatever the camel was carrying, only then, could they enter.

If we look at our own lives, we can most likely think of something that we tightly carry with us. Maybe it is possessions — material goods or money — like Jesus references in our Gospel. Or maybe it is something less material — like status, pride, or control.

Jesus doesn’t want our stuff — our job promotions, our designer house, or our bank account. He just wants us. So, we need to be willing to strip those things from our lives in order to reach Him.

It might seem difficult, but the outcome will be more than we could have ever imagined — peace on earth and treasure in heaven.



History of the Holy Rosary

The rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of our Catholic Church. Introduced by the Creed, the Our Father, three Hail Marys and the Doxology ("Glory Be"), and concluded with the Salve Regina, the rosary involves the recitation of five decades consisting of the Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and the Doxology. During this recitation, the individual meditates on the saving mysteries of our Lord's life and the faithful witness of our Blessed Mother.

Journeying through the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries of the rosary, the individual recalls our Lord's incarnation, His passion and death and His resurrection from the dead. In so doing, the rosary assists us in growing in a deeper appreciation of these mysteries, in uniting our life more closely to our Lord and in imploring His graced assistance to live the faith. We also ask for the prayers of our Blessed Mother, who leads all believers to her Son.

The use of "prayer beads" and the repeated recitation of prayers to aid in meditation stem from the earliest days of the Church and has roots in pre-Christian times. Evidence exists from the Middle Ages that strings of beads were used to count Our Fathers

and Hail Marys. These strings of beads became known as "Paternosters," the Latin for "Our Father."

The structure of the rosary gradually evolved between the 12th and 15th centuries. Eventually 50 Hail Marys were recited and

linked with verses of psalms or other phrases evoking the lives of Jesus and Mary. During this time, this prayer form became known as the rosarium ("rose garden"), a common term to designate a collection of similar material, such as an anthology of stories on the same subject or theme. During the 16th century, the structure of the five-decade rosary based on the three sets of mysteries prevailed.

Tradition does hold that St. Dominic (d. 1221) devised the rosary as we know it. Moved by a vision of our Blessed Mother, he preached the use of the rosary in his missionary work among the Albigensians, who had denied the mystery of Christ. The earliest accounts of his life do not mention it, the Dominican constitutions do not link him with it and contemporaneous portraits do not include it as a symbol to identify the saint.

There will be a potluck from 4:30-6:00 pm in the courtyard on the side of the church, followed by adoration 6:00-7:00 pm.


Family Adoration will consist of 20 minutes of adoration and prayer all together, geared towards exposing kids to Jesus in the Eucharist.



In our understanding of stewardship, we talk about time, talent, and treasure. Time predominantly refers to our prayer life, talent refers to our abilities, and treasure to our finances.

Today, we hear Jesus use the word "treasure" in connection with heaven. We gain insight into the truth that our treasure is something far greater than our monetary wealth. Our true treasure is kept in a place that is safe from the destructive things of this world. No one can steal our true treasure, no one can destroy it, and we cannot even give it away, because our true treasure is not here, but in heaven. Jesus continually encourages his listeners to understand that wealth is not of this world. The material things we struggle for are simply meant to be sufficient for a day, as in "our daily bread". What is left-over, the surplus wealth of this world is meant to be used for the needs of others so that all have sufficient for a day. This is why treasure is the least important of the three "T's", because when you use your time and talents properly, your treasure automatically flourishes.

Thank you again to all for taking your time in prayer to understand more deeply the call to good stewardship.

LESSON OVERVIEW

GOD is the CREATOR

God is the Creator of everything that is, including everything we can see and everything we cannot see. God is the source of all life, and everything good comes from Him. Your children will also begin to understand that God communicates invisible, spiritual realities to us through visible, material signs and symbols in creation.

MEMORY VERSE

1 JOHN 4:8

“Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.”

WHAT IS A SACRAMENT?

A Sacrament is a visible sign instituted by Christ to give grace. God loved us so much that He assumed a human nature, suffered, and died on the Cross for us. The invisible God became visible in the Person of Jesus Christ. He showed us His invisible love through His visible Sacrifice on the Cross. Human beings require physical things to draw us to the divine. For that reason, the Church works in ways that are both physical and spiritual. The Church carries out this work through the seven Sacraments: signs and symbols that show us and change us by the mystery of God's love. In the seven Sacraments, we can see God's love for us and His plan for our salvation.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS- If Heaven were like Harvard

There's no getting around it: life on earth can seem easier if you're rich. Most of the bodily and material needs a person could have are fulfilled if you've got a little bit of money behind you. So why doesn't this same theory apply to entering the kingdom of Heaven? Why isn't Heaven like an Ivy League school, where a connection and a hasty tuition check might open a lot of doors?

When you think about it, the virtues required to enter Heaven — things like charity and justice and courage — should be even closer within the grasp of those who never had to worry about where their food is coming from. In theory, your capacity for good works should only increase with the resources at your disposal. The same is true for stewardship potential. Let's say I've got a lot of talent. Maybe I've got a lot of free time. On paper, it should be easier for me to give freely of these gifts, because I have the luxury that eluded the widow and her two coins: I can see my ample gift being put into action, when so many can only offer what they have and remind themselves that God sees it and appreciates it.

But here we get into the mess of humanity: if we have a lot of something, it means we have a lot of something we could use any way we want. And then we hear the whisper of the serpent: Think of what this (money, time, talent) could do for you.

May we pray for God to give us the heart of the widow, no matter our resources.


