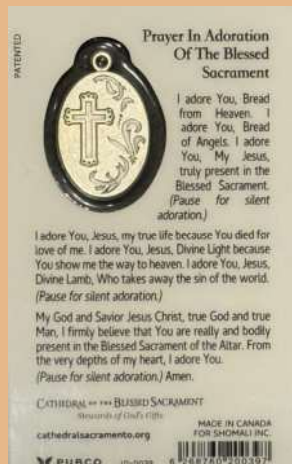

Managing God's Gifts To Us

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP?

Stewardship is the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor. The U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship states "As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord."

Three "T's" of Stewardship—Time, Talent, & Treasure

Stewardship of Time: Using my time on earth wisely; making time for personal prayer, family prayer and quality time with friends and loved ones.

Stewardship of Talent: Using my God-given abilities to strengthen the Church and help others, especially through parish ministries and activities.

Stewardship of Treasure: The wise and just management of my financial resources; giving an appropriate amount of my income to the parish.

Four Pillars of Stewardship

Building a Stewardship Parish on Four Pillars:

Hospitality – Christian Kindness

"When I was a stranger, you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:35). The Gospel teaches that whenever we welcome the least of our brothers or sisters, we welcome Christ himself. That is why the first mark of a stewardship parish is hospitality.

Prayer – A Heart-to-Heart with God

Every great saint has taught that prayer is the most essential component in the life of the Christian. Through prayer, we nurture our most important relationship — the one that will last for all eternity.

Formation – Continuous Conversion

From childhood through adulthood, our whole life must be a process of drawing closer to God. He never stops calling us forward to learn more and to examine ourselves more deeply.

Service – Love in Action

"Amen I say to you, whatever you did to the least of my brothers, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40). While we may not view ourselves as saints, we too are called to such heroic service within our own community.

¿QUÉ ES LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD?

La administración es la respuesta agradecida de un discípulo cristiano que reconoce y recibe los dones de Dios y los comparte por amor a Dios y al prójimo. La Carta Pastoral de los Obispos de los Estados Unidos sobre la Administración afirma: «Como administradores cristianos, recibimos los dones de Dios con gratitud, los cultivamos con responsabilidad, los compartimos con amor y justicia con los demás, y los devolvemos con creces al Señor».

Las tres «T» de la corresponsabilidad: tiempo, talento y tesoro

Corresponsabilidad del tiempo: utilizar mi tiempo en la tierra de forma inteligente; dedicar tiempo a la oración personal, la oración en familia y a pasar tiempo de calidad con amigos y seres queridos.

Custodia del talento: utilizar las habilidades que Dios me ha dado para fortalecer la Iglesia y ayudar a los demás, especialmente a través de los ministerios y actividades parroquiales.

Custodia del tesoro: la gestión sabia y justa de mis recursos financieros; dar una cantidad adecuada de mis ingresos a la parroquia.

Los cuatro pilares de la corresponsabilidad

Construir una parroquia corresponsable sobre cuatro pilares:

Hospitalidad: bondad cristiana

«Cuando era forastero, me acogisteis» (Mateo 25, 35). El Evangelio nos enseña que cada vez que acogemos al más pequeño de nuestros hermanos o hermanas, acogemos al mismo Cristo. Por eso, la primera característica de una parroquia corresponsable es la hospitalidad.

Oración: un diálogo íntimo con Dios.

Todos los grandes santos han enseñado que la oración es el componente más esencial en la vida del cristiano. A través de la oración, cultivamos nuestra relación más importante, la que durará por toda la eternidad.

Formación: conversión continua.

Desde la infancia hasta la edad adulta, toda nuestra vida debe ser un proceso de acercamiento a Dios. Él nunca deja de llamarnos a aprender más y a examinarnos más profundamente.

Servicio: amor en acción.

«En verdad os digo que cuanto hicisteis a uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, a mí me lo hicisteis» (Mateo 25, 40). Aunque no nos consideremos santos, también nosotros estamos llamados a ese servicio heroico dentro de nuestra propia comunidad.

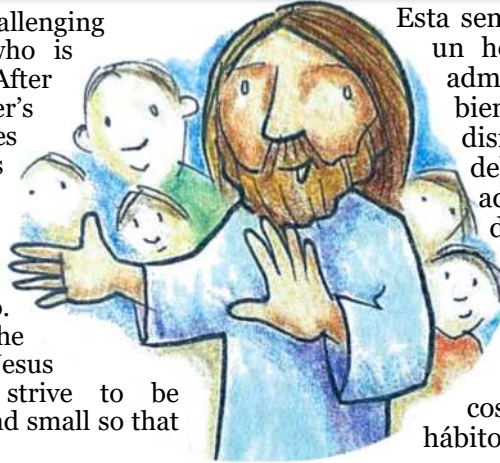

This week we hear a challenging parable about a rich man who is cheated by his steward. After squandering his master's property, the steward makes amends with his master's debtors by lowering their debts. The steward hopes that this goodwill offering will help repair friendships with those in the community he has lied to. The master commends the steward for acting wisely. Jesus reiterates that we should strive to be trustworthy in both big ways and small so that we develop honest habits.

To be a saint we must have good habits; not just when people see us but especially when nobody sees. What good habit do you have? What bad habit do you need to change?

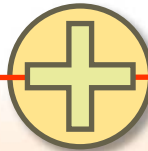

Summary of the Readings:

- **First Reading** – Amos 6:1A, 4-7: God condemns those living in luxury and indifference in Zion, foretelling their exile and end of their extravagant celebrations.
- **Responsorial Psalm** – Psalm 146: God brings justice, feeds the hungry, frees prisoners, heals the blind, and supports the downtrodden, orphan, and widow, reigning eternally over all generations.
- **Second Reading** – 1 Timothy 6:11-16: A man of God is urged to pursue virtues and hold onto eternal life, keeping commandments until Christ's return, honoring the immortal, unseen Sovereign.
- **Gospel** – Luke 16:19-31: Jesus narrated a parable contrasting a rich man's luxurious life with Lazarus, a destitute man. After death, Lazarus found comfort with Abraham, while the rich man suffered. The rich man's plea for relief and a warning for his brothers was denied, emphasizing the sufficiency of Moses and the prophets' teachings.

Reflect:

In the Gospel, a rich man feasts on big meals with lots of leftovers. A beggar sits at his gate, but the rich man never notices the beggar. The rich man has to be pretty blind not to notice him—or does he notice and not have compassion?

- ♦ As Jesus followers, we are called to take notice of those around us, and care for their temporal and spiritual needs. Jesus calls all to his family. How can you invite others to his table to celebrate the Eucharist?
- ♦ Who are the 'Lazaruses' that you encounter. Who are those you see choose to help them? Who are those overlooked?
- ♦ Pray with Psalm 146.

Resumen de las lecturas:

- **Primera lectura:** Amós 6:1A, 4-7: Dios condena a quienes viven en el lujo y la indiferencia en Sión, prediciendo su exilio y el fin de sus extravagantes celebraciones.
- **Salmo responsorial:** Salmo 146: Dios hace justicia, alimenta a los hambrientos, libera a los prisioneros, cura a los ciegos y apoya a los oprimidos, a los huérfanos y a las viudas, reinando eternamente sobre todas las generaciones.
- **Segunda lectura** – 1 Timoteo 6:11-16: Se exhorta al hombre de Dios a perseguir las virtudes y aferrarse a la vida eterna, guardando los mandamientos hasta el regreso de Cristo, honrando al Soberano inmortal e invisible.
- **Evangelio:** Lucas 16:19-31: Jesús narró una parábola en la que contrastaba la vida lujosa de un hombre rico con la de Lázaro, un hombre indigente. Tras su muerte, Lázaro encontró consuelo con Abraham, mientras que el hombre rico sufría. La súplica del hombre rico para que se le aliviaran sus penas y la advertencia a sus hermanos fueron denegadas, lo que enfatizaba la suficiencia de las enseñanzas de Moisés y los profetas.

Reflejar:

En el Evangelio, un hombre rico se da un festín con grandes comidas que dejan muchos restos. Un mendigo se sienta a su puerta, pero el rico nunca se fija en él. El rico tiene que estar bastante ciego para no verlo, ¿o es que lo ve y no siente compassion?

- ♦ Como seguidores de Jesús, estamos llamados a fijarnos en los que nos rodean y a cuidar de sus necesidades temporales y espirituales. Jesús llama a todos a su familia. ¿Cómo puedes invitar a otros a su mesa para celebrar la Eucaristía?
- ♦ ¿Quiénes son los «Lázaros» con los que te encuentras? ¿Quiénes son los que ves que deciden ayudarlos? ¿Quiénes son los que pasan desapercibidos?
- ♦ Reza con el Salmo 146.

Liturgy of the Word

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

READING 1 AM 8:4-7

Hear this, you who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land! "When will the new moon be over," you ask, "that we may sell our grain, and the sabbath, that we may display the wheat? We will diminish the ephah, add to the shekel, and fix our scales for cheating! We will buy the lowly for silver, and the poor for a pair of sandals; even the refuse of the wheat we will sell!" The LORD has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Never will I forget a thing they have done!

READING 2 1 TM 2:1-8

Beloved:

First of all, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity. This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth. For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as ransom for all. This was the testimony at the proper time. For this I was appointed preacher and apostle—I am speaking the truth, I am not lying—, teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

It is my wish, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument.

GOSPEL LK 16:1-13

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.

"For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? 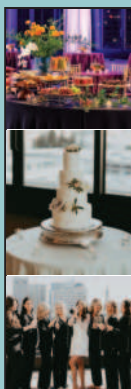

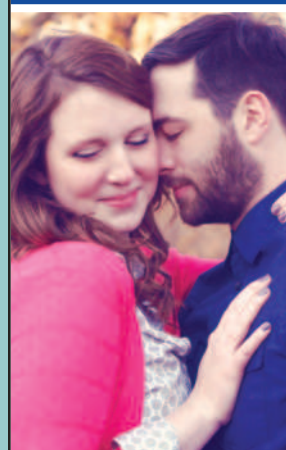
