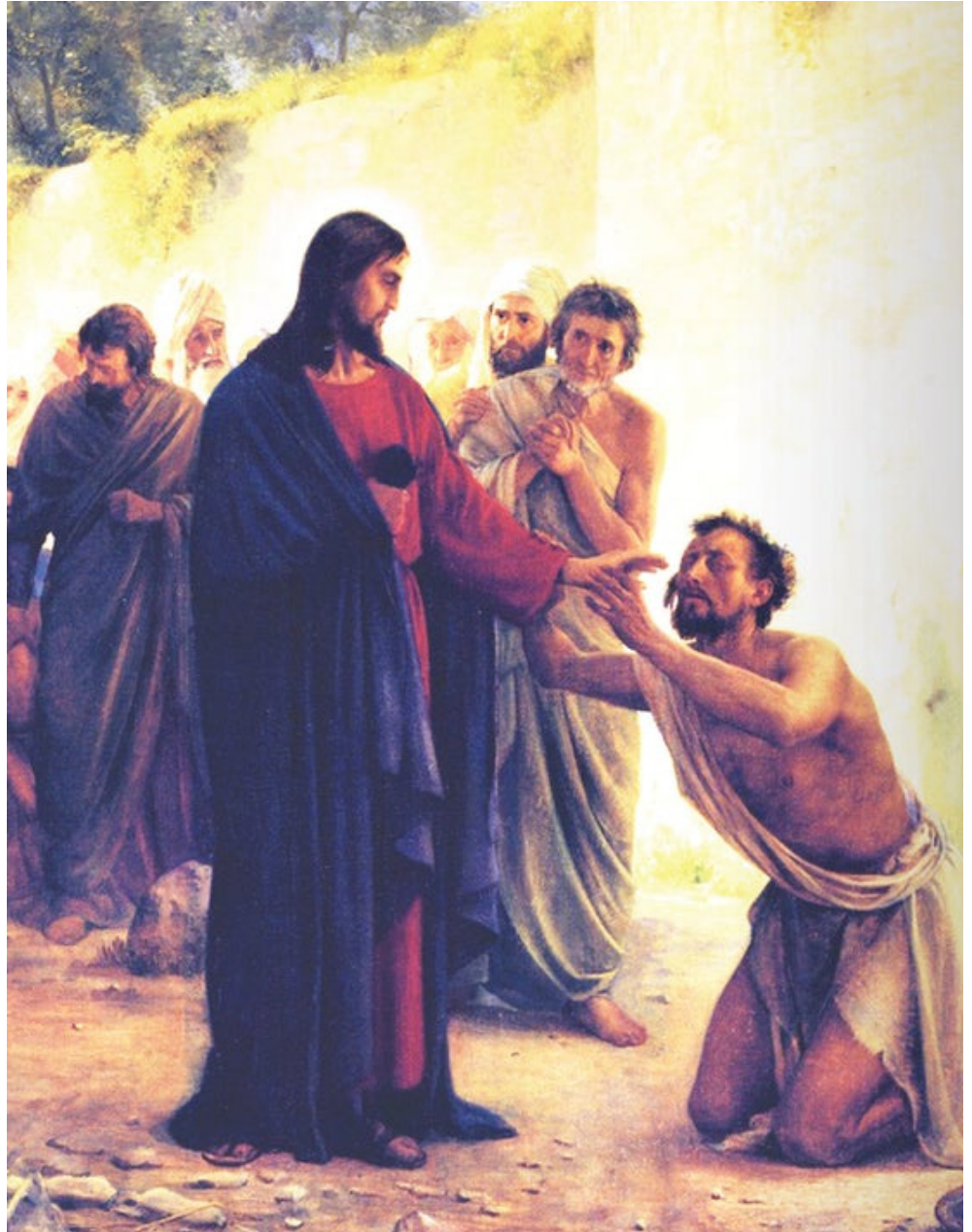

Gospel Reflection

God heals us of our blindness

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus opens the eyes of a man who has been blind from birth. Though he has been without physical sight, this man is the only one in the story who sees Jesus for who he really is. The man's neighbors, parents, and teachers are spiritually blind to the knowledge that Jesus is the Messiah. This story invites us to use our sight to see both with wonder and with faith. The opening of the eyes of the man born blind begins a conversion journey that brings him to understand that Jesus must be from God. The man born blind discovers that he believes in Jesus as he answers questions from his neighbors and his teachers about how he received his sight. The man gains insight as he speaks for himself. As he interacts with others, the man reflects and recognizes Jesus as the one in whom he believes.



Catechesis: Anointing of the Sick

Every sacrament can be found in Sacred Scripture because Jesus modeled for us what he wanted his priests to continue. In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus heals a man who has been blind since birth. Jesus could accomplish this with a word, but because God created us with bodies and senses, Jesus uses physical touch and clay to heal the man. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the priest uses oil and prayer to bless the sick person. This sacrament sometimes brings about a physical healing, but a spiritual healing and forgiveness of sin are always present. (See CCC, 1511.)



4º Domingo de la Cuaresema

Reflexión sobre el Evangelio

Dios nos cura de nuestra ceguera.

En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús abre los ojos de un hombre que había nacido ciego. Aunque este hombre no podía ver con los ojos del cuerpo, fue el único en este relato que es capaz de ver quién es Jesús realmente. Los vecinos del hombre, sus padres y maestros están espiritualmente ciegos y no reconocen que Jesús es el Mesías. Este relato nos invita a usar nuestros ojos para ver con ojos de asombro y con la fe. Cuando Jesús abre los ojos del ciego, el hombre inicia un camino de conversión que lo lleva a ver que Jesús realmente viene de Dios. El ciego de nacimiento descubre que él cree en Jesús y responde a sus vecinos y maestros cuando estos le preguntan cómo recibió la vista. Este hombre logra comprender cuando habla por sí mismo. Luego, al interactuar con los demás, el hombre reflexiona y reconoce que cree en Jesús.

Catechesis: Unción de los enfermos

Todos los sacramentos se encuentran en la Sagrada Escritura porque Jesús nos dio ejemplo de lo que quería que sus sacerdotes continuaran haciendo. En el Evangelio del domingo, Jesús cura a un hombre que era ciego de nacimiento. Jesús podría haberlo hecho con una sola palabra, pero como Dios nos creó con un cuerpo y sentidos, Jesús utiliza el contacto físico y el barro para curar al hombre. En el sacramento de la unción de los enfermos, el sacerdote utiliza aceite y oración para bendecir al enfermo. Este sacramento a veces produce una curación física, pero la curación espiritual y el perdón de los pecados siempre están presentes. (Véase CCC, 1511.)

Saint of the Week | Santo de la Semana—19 MAR

Saint Joseph—Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Saint Joseph was a 1st-century Jewish carpenter of Nazareth, husband of the Virgin Mary, and foster father of Jesus Christ, chosen by God to guard and protect the Holy Family. Known as a "just man," he obediently took Mary as his wife after an angel revealed her pregnancy was by the Holy Spirit. Joseph is the patron of the Universal Church, fathers, workers (specifically carpenters), families, and the dying.

The Scrutinies: A Way of Spiritual Purification

In Catholic tradition, the Scrutinies are special rites of prayer and reflection celebrated for those preparing for Baptism at the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), especially during Lent.

What are the Scrutinies?

The Scrutinies are three sacred rites celebrated on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent. They are meant to help the Elect (those preparing for Baptism at Easter) undergo spiritual purification and strengthening.

The word “scrutiny” here means *allowing God to search and heal the heart*. It is not about judgment by others, but about God’s loving examination that leads to healing and freedom.

What do the Scrutinies do?

- * **Reveal** what is weak or sinful in the heart
- * **Strengthen** what is good and holy
- * **Free** the person from the power of sin and evil
- * **Prepare** Elect for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- * **Deepen** conversion and trust in Christ

Even though the Scrutinies are for the Elect, they also invite **all of us to examine our own hearts** and grow in conversion during Lent.

Want to become Catholic?

For those seeking Christ and the Sacraments in the Catholic Church.

For those not baptized who are seeking faith and meaning.

For those baptized in the Catholic or other Christian tradition but did not receive Confirmation and Eucharist.

2. The Man Born Blind

John 9

Jesus, the Light of the World



From Blindness
to True Sight

Each Scrutiny is connected to a powerful reading from the Gospel of Saint John:

- **3rd Sunday of Lent:**
Woman at the Well (John 4)
Jesus as Living Water
- **4th Sunday of Lent:**
The Man Born Blind (John 9)
Jesus as Light of the World
- **5th Sunday of Lent:**
The Raising of Lazarus (Jn 11)
Jesus the Resurrection & Life

These three themes help us ‘scrutinize’ the human condition and reflect on how Jesus leads us from thirst to fulfillment; blindness to sight; and death to new life.

The narrative of the Man Born Blind in John 9 is not merely about physical healing; it is a transformative journey from darkness to light, from ignorance to understanding, from mere existence to a life of faith. The man born blind represents the human condition without Christ—unable to perceive the fullness of truth. His encounter with Jesus is a living parable of conversion and enlightenment, one that mirrors our Elect and Candidates’ journey toward the sacraments of initiation.



Ask yourself:

- * **Identifying Blindness:** *In what areas of your life do you feel unable to see God’s presence, guidance, or truth? What “shadows” in your life (old habits, fears) obscure the light of Christ?*
- * **Experience of Light:** *How has Christ already brought healing—physically, emotionally or spiritually—into your life?*
- * **Journey of Faith:** *Like the blind man, how has your understanding of Jesus grown from seeing him merely as a prophet to recognizing Him as Lord?*
- * **Courage to Witness:** *Where in your life do you need courage to stand up for what you know is true about your faith, even when others doubt or oppose you?*
- * **Actionable Growth:** *How can you, like the man born blind, move from a state of “blindness” to actively testifying about how God has opened your eyes?*



Hello, I am Josue Castellanos Barragan, and I am doing a project centered around the work St. Vincent de Paul does for the homeless. My opinion is that more of the church community should volunteer with St. Vincent de Paul to help the homeless. That way, we can give care and aid to those who need it most.

St. Vincent de Paul is a volunteer group that is tasked with feeding and providing for the homeless. We do this every Thursday evening at around 6:30, where we meet up at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament and usually end at Cesar Chavez Park. We help provide for those who aren't as lucky as to have food or a shelter. We feed about 50 homeless people every week, so we walk about 40 miles. In total, we walk 1,200 miles a year. This matters because feeding the homeless was important to St. Vincent de Paul. It was a way of serving the Lord, which is why we do this job of caring for the homeless.

When I started doing this project, I wasn't too sure what to do since I didn't know much about community issues until I was told about this group by the Deacon. Based on my overall experience with the group, I feel like we have done well to help feed or provide other necessities to the homeless. My family and I have also contributed to the group in one way or another, mostly by bringing food to them as well. Also, from my time knowing the group, they are good people who help provide for the homeless, and I get along well with them. While what we are doing now is good, there can be other ways that the rest of us can contribute to the organization in the future.

One issue that faces the homeless is mental health. When I first researched this matter in August 2025, I had read about the relationship between homelessness and mental health. Based on what we've experienced when doing our rounds, we have encountered those who are unfortunately not well mentally, and that can be sad. According to *Mental Health and Homelessness, Get to Know the Facts*, homelessness causes mental health problems because of the situations they are living in. It can also be the opposite way around, as mental health or other issues were what caused them to be homeless. As you can see, mental health has had a huge effect on these people. Why it matters to St. Paul is that the more the homeless live with mental health problems, the less they can survive homelessness.

To show how St. Vincent de Paul would like to seek assistance, I sent out questions to one of the group members, Adrian, mostly based on his experience and work. I asked him what additional assistance he would like to see in the future, and he said:

"I wish the ministry would have the resources or collaboration with other organizations to provide more assistance to those who are experiencing mental health episodes or don't appear to be able to have the facilities to care for themselves. This requires the attention of trained professionals with access to the appropriate resources to assist those individuals."

To conclude, I would say that the best call to action, in my opinion, is to help provide for St. Vincent de Paul so that the group can have additional help in order to care for the homeless. It would help if you could either join our group, or, as mentioned by Adrian, is that in the future, St. Vincent de Paul would like to see further assistance provided to those who need more medical attention. I would suggest contacting the group if you want to join or help assist them. We would appreciate it if you can support our group in any way you can to change somebody's life. Thank you.

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

The patron saint of charitable societies, St. Vincent de Paul is primarily recognized for his charity and compassion for the poor.

(born April 24, 1581, Pouy, now Saint-Vincent-de-Paul, France—died September 27, 1660, Paris; canonized 1737; feast day September 27)
