

Join us in praying a Rosary Novena for 54 days

Many of us are worn from the ongoing opening and closures of churches and businesses over the last five months, and it is understandable the weight of the uncertainty weighs on us. For this we invite you to unite your prayers with ours in praying for our faith community, Church leaders and wider community.

What is a 54 Day Rosary Novena?

On February 16, 1884, an afflicted girl and her relatives commenced a novena of Rosaries. The Queen of the Holy Rosary favored her with an apparition on March 3rd. Mary, sitting upon a high throne, surrounded by luminous figures, held the divine Child on her lap, and in her hand a Rosary. The Virgin Mother and the Holy Infant, accompanied by Saint Dominic and Saint Catherine of Siena. Mary looked upon the sufferer with maternal tenderness and the patient saluted her with the words: "Queen of the Holy Rosary, be gracious to me; restore me to health!" "Child", responded the Blessed Virgin, "... this name is most precious and dear to me. Make three novenas, and thou shalt obtain all". Once more the Queen of the Holy Rosary appeared to her and said: "Whoever desires to obtain favors from me should make three novenas of the prayers of the Rosary, and three novenas in thanksgiving".

How do you pray the Novena?

The 54 Day Rosary Novena consists of five decades of the Rosary each day for 27 days in petition; then immediately five decades each day for 27 days in thanksgiving, whether or not the request has been granted. The meditations vary from day to day. On the first day meditate on the Joyful Mysteries; on the second day the Sorrowful Mysteries; on the third day the Glorious Mysteries and on the fourth day the Luminous Mysteries; and so on throughout the 54 days.

To help you navigate each day of the Novena, we will send out to subscribers the daily prayers to their email box. This is a great way to unite our efforts and petitions for an end of the virus' spread and healing for our land and community.

"And Jesus walked about in the temple area on the Portico of Solomon." Gospel According to Saint John 10:23

"Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes." Acts of the Apostles 2:46a

"Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. They were all together in Solomon's portico." Acts of the Apostles 5:12

In the ancient temple in Jerusalem there was a portico or porch that ran along the eastern side of the temple court. It was a place where people gathered to hear teachers talk about the scriptures. It was an outdoor setting with lots of room.

Jesus chose to teach there and the first gathering of people who would later be called "Christians" occurred. There were no church buildings, and this was the best way to accommodate so many people after Pentecost that believed the word that Peter and the apostles shared, roughly 3000 souls.

This last Sunday, July 19, 2020, at the English 7:30 AM and the Spanish 9:00 AM Masses, we at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament located in downtown Sacramento had its own version of Solomon's Portico.

Since Sacramento County is on the Governor's Watch List, and due to the recent directive from our Bishop, it was decided to hold those Masses outdoors. And so, many of us met on the patio and adjacent parking area just off Jazz Alley, between the Cathedral and the parking structure.



I attended the 7:30 AM Mass and was deeply blessed. Next to the Cathedral is a building that functions as a storage area, choir practice area, and classrooms for the Cathedral. It also has office space, and is called the Manogue Building, named after Bishop Manogue, founder of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, and founder of the Diocese of Sacramento.

On the outside of the building, facing the patio and parking area is a fire escape ladder with four landings. On the top landing an altar had been placed, and Father O'Reilly celebrated the Mass from there. Going down the ladder, on the second landing, and ambo was placed. From there, the Word of the Lord was proclaimed, and the Cantor lead us in song. A small pump organ provided the music and can be seen in the lower right-hand corner of the photo.

The chairs were placed to ensure social distancing was maintained, and everyone wore masks. Our Cathedral Young Adults did a wonderful job of greeting people and helped to have an easy and orderly experience.

These last few months have been a time of uncertainty, and risk. Personally, I have taken advantage of the online streaming Masses provided by the Cathedral. However, with the advent of outdoor Masses, I feel that the risk is greatly reduced. So, for me, it is a blessing in disguise to meet outdoors.

We must all discern, do a risk assessment, and search our hearts for what God is asking us to do. I honor each person's decision. Until things change, and as long Mass is outdoors, we maintain proper social distancing, and all wear masks, I'll be attending the 7:30 AM Mass.

This week in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus continues his teaching us with parables. He talks about finding treasure in a field, a pearl of great price and the sorting of fish. All of these parables help us see what

the kingdom of God looks like. In the last one, he speaks about a fisherman who hauls in his net with all kinds of fish gathered in it. He goes through the net, separating the good fish from the bad, keeping the good and throwing away the bad. This is similar to last week's parable about the farmer who waited until harvest time to separate the wheat (good) from the weeds (bad). Imagine that in these parables, Jesus is the landowner and the fisherman; we are the servants who help plant and help throw the nets for the catch. It is not our job to sort out who is good and who is bad; that is the work of Jesus alone, and he will wait until the end of time to do the sorting. Our job is simply to help gather all to know and love Jesus Crucified and Risen. We cannot judge who is good or bad; if we try we may make a terrible mistake because of how someone appears to us. We do not see what it going

on in the heart—and that is why we leave the sorting to Jesus who sees in the heart of each one of us. Let us pray, then, for Jesus to use us to bring all to him, and let him do the sorting of the hearts of people.

Esta semana, en el Evangelio de Mateo, Jesús continúa enseñándonos con parábolas. Nos habla de encontrar tesoros en un campo, una perla de gran valor y la clasificación de peces. Todas estas parábolas nos ayudan

a ver cómo es el reino de Dios. En el último, habla de un pescador que transporta en su red todo tipo de peces reunidos en ella. Pasa por la red, separando a los peces buenos de los malos, manteniendo lo bueno y tirando lo malo. Esto es similar a la parábola de la semana pasada sobre el agricultor que esperó hasta la época de cosecha para separar el trigo (bueno) de la hierba (malo). Imagínese que en estas parábolas, Jesús es el terrateniente y el pescador; nosotros los sirvientes que ayudan a plantar y ayudan a lanzar las redes para la captura. No es nuestro trabajo averiguar quién es bueno y quién es malo; esa es la obra de Jesús solamente, y esperará hasta el final de los tiempos para hacer la clasificación. Nuestro trabajo es simplemente ayudar a reunir a todos para conocer y amar a Jesús Crucificado y Resucitado. No podemos juzgar quién es bueno o malo; si lo intentamos podemos cometer un terrible error debido a cómo alquien nos parece. No vemos lo que está pasando en el corazón, y es por eso que dejamos

la clasificación a Jesús que ve en el corazón de cada uno de nosotros. Oremos, pues, para que Jesús nos use para traerlo todo a él, y que haga la clasificación de los corazones de las personas.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: What Is God Asking of You?

What are you willing to give for the sake of the kingdom of God? Often, we begin a discussion like this with a story or a

few leading thoughts. However, if we are to be serious about who we claim to be as Christians, there should be no beating around the bush. that because we aren't being asked or because we aren't listening? If you are counting on me and I am on you, we should figure this out sooner than later. Of course, I suspect we actually do know the answer, don't we?
