

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. For centuries we as Catholics celebrated this Feast on Jan. 6, but the decision was made a number of years ago (at least in the United States) to celebrate the Epiphany on the Sunday which falls between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8. "Epiphany" means "manifestation." It is on this day that Jesus Christ, the Messiah, is revealed as the light of all nations. Officially Christmas is not over. In fact, the recommendation of the Church is that on this day those who display a crèche, a nativity or manger scene, should replace the shepherd and sheep with the Magi and their likely animals on which they traveled as well as their gifts. However, that is all secondary to the real meaning of this day. At Christmas the Messiah Jesus was revealed to the shepherds, who were Jewish. But on this day the Lord is revealed to all nations and to the Gentiles (represented by the Magi). We are all familiar with the star the Magi followed, but we need to understand all that is happening and what it means. This all represents the Light of Christ, a Light which today we honor and commemorate. We are called to be the Light of Christ right now to those around us and those with whom we come in contact. That way we can be the disciples Christ wants us to be. The poet William Cullen Bryant captures the significance of the star the Magi followed very well when he wrote, "O Father, may that Holy Star, Grow every year more bright, And send its glorious beams afar, To fill the world with light."



THE FEAST OF THE *Epiphany*

EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25. In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday, the upcoming dates were "proclaimed" after the gospel in this way:

Know dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the second day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the seventeenth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-ninth day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ. On the fifth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the nineteenth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the twenty-seventh day of November, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.





A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) Fr. Abraham Chiu (趙必成神父)

In God, there is only love; in love, there is only grace; and in grace, there is eternal life.

The Blessed Virgin Mary is assigned by God the mission of God, i.e., being the mother of God.

Therefore, her whole person has been living in God's grace when she was conceived in her mother's womb.

That is the project of God's salvation.

When the angel conveyed the mission of God to Mary, Gabriel said: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!"

The passive verb of "full of grace" (kecharitōmenē) is not meant as "being full." "Being full" is still a quantitative calculation. The literal translation of the Greek verb "kecharitōmenē" should be "to be favored," or simply said, "to be graced." In other words, Mary lives in the grace of God and is not at all related to sin.

Mary is already saved in anticipation even though Jesus has not been born and resurrected from the dead. In the perfect grace of God, Mary is created and called to be the mother of God.

We see from the Immaculate Conception that Mary lives for Jesus with all her life. As her children, we are called to follow our heavenly mother's good example as to live for God with all our lives.

“充滿恩寵者” (kecharitōmenē) 這個被動語態動詞，本意不是“充滿”，“充滿”還是有數量的計算，從不滿到充滿，是數量評估。希臘詞“kecharitōmenē”直譯是“被恩寵化”；意即瑪利亞整個人都活在天主恩寵當中，沒有絲毫與罪惡有關。

縱然耶穌還沒降生以及死而復活，天主恩寵卻沒有時空限制，因此，在天主恩寵當中，瑪利亞被創造，並且被召叫成為天主之母。

表面上耶穌在聖母胎中，其實，是聖母在天主聖三的恩寵裡面，是天主讓瑪利亞脫離罪惡，與耶穌合作，完成救贖工程。

聖母無玷始胎，這特恩不是為她，而是為降生成人的耶穌基督。

聖母一輩子，都為耶穌而活。讓我們效法聖母榜樣，一生為主而

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life." If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?" That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

電影的結尾，喬治·貝禮意識到他的一生也非凡無比，因為他沒有成就於自己故事中的英雄，而是讓自己的善良反映在他人身上。請記住- 賢士們沒有為自己制定路線，他們只是跟隨那顆星星。


