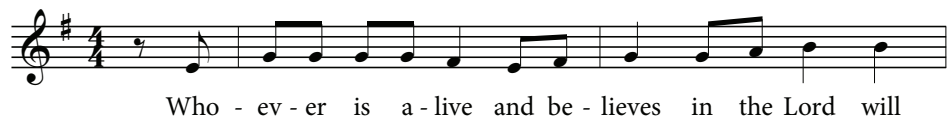

Today we celebrate the Third Scrutiny for our Elect, those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. As you recall, scrutiny means to search. The Elect should focus their thoughts today on the story of Lazarus, who was raised from the dead, and their own “Passover” from death to life. These scrutinies also apply to us, the community of the baptized, who need this strengthening help during Lent on our journey to Easter.

The assembly is invited to pray in silence that these Elect will be given a spirit of repentance, a sense of sin, and the true freedom of the children of God.

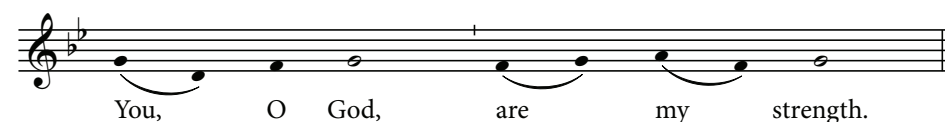

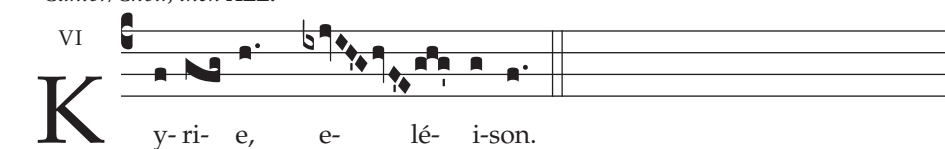

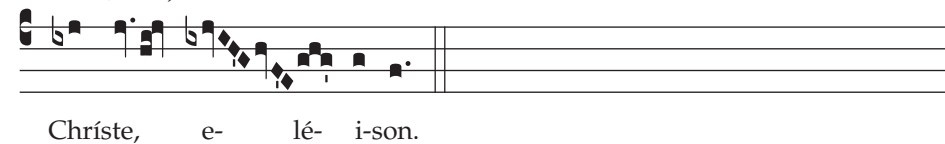

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be through all the ages.






