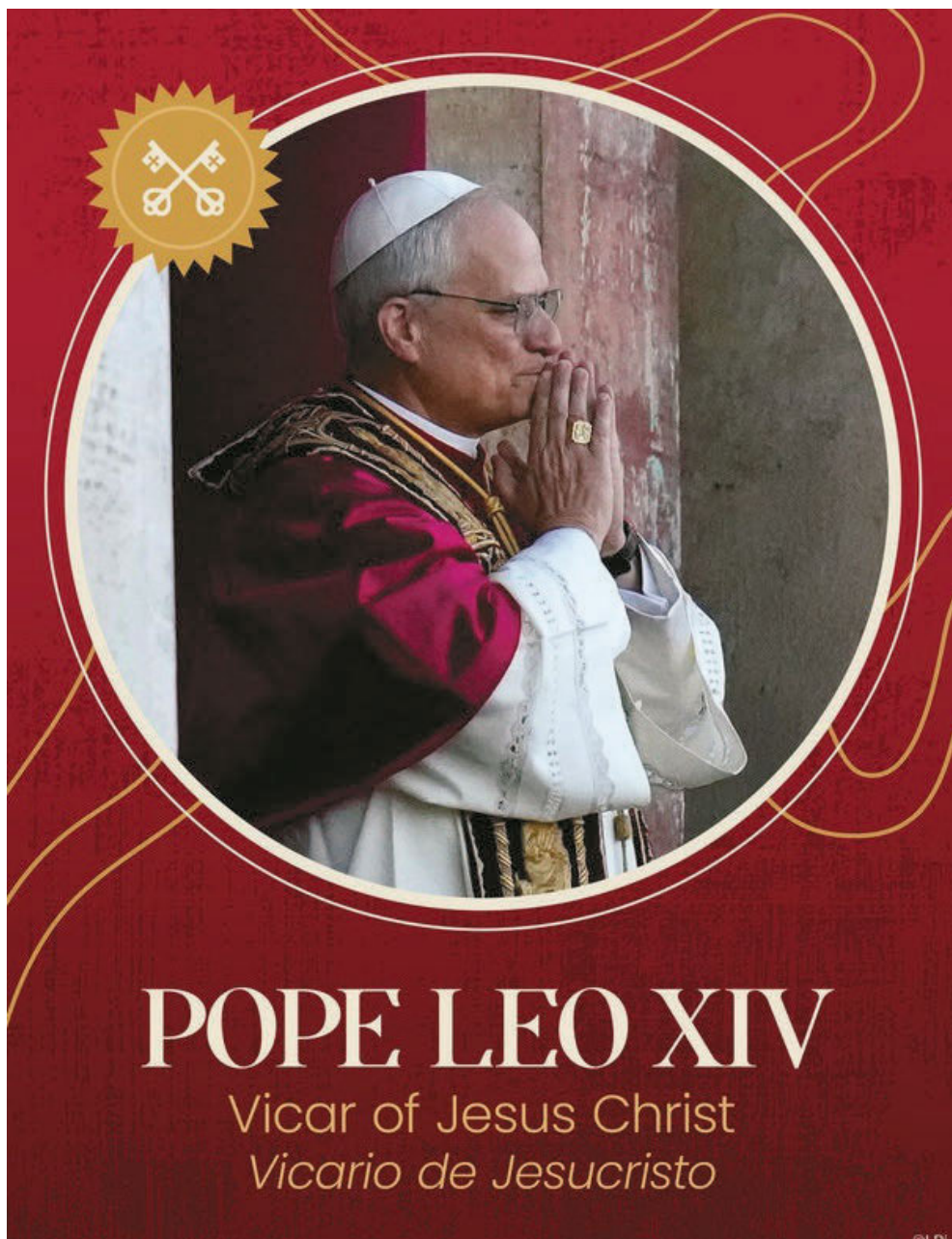

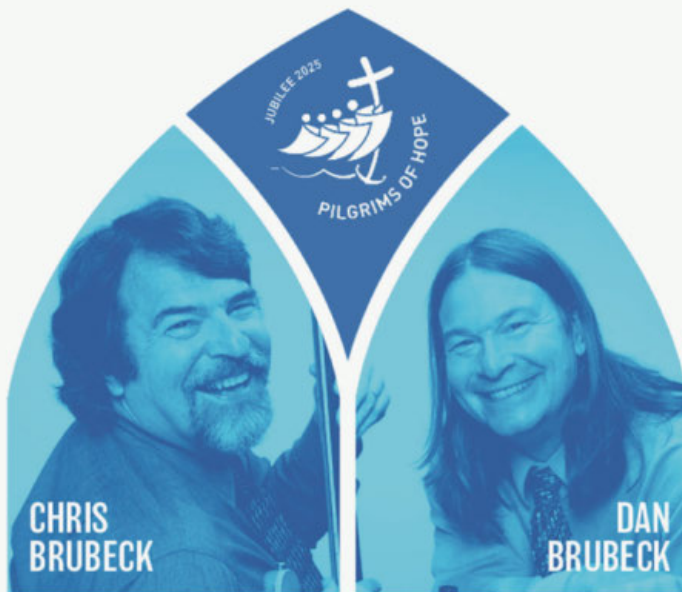

Pilgrims of Hope: "...built upon the foundation of the apostles ..." Eph. 2:20

Habemus Papam! We have a Pope! At the time of this writing the Conclave—the process of the election the Pope—just concluded with the selection of Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, taking the name Leo XIV. It is an exciting time in our Universal Church—and our Family Faith Formation is walking with the church. Families are learning about how a pope is chosen and growing in appreciation for the Petrine Office and how the Keys (authority) of Saint Peter is handed down from Peter to his successors. We also learned we too have an important role during a Conclave to pray for the will of God to be done through the Cardinal electors. This week, we continue along this theme by reflecting on **The Apostles, Our Firm Foundation**. We know some things about the early beginnings of the Church from the Acts of the Apostles. About 16 years after the death of Jesus, Pope Peter's decision at the Council of Jerusalem (50 AD) made it possible to start preaching to the Gentiles. Before that, most of the followers of Jesus were Jewish by birth. Peter and the other Apostles traveled as missionaries, suffered persecution, and spread the Good News of new life through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Our Bishops—in collaboration with our priests and laity—continue this ministry today.



¡Habemus Papam! ¡Tenemos Papa! En el momento de escribir esto el Cónclave-el proceso de elección del Papa-acaba de concluir con la selección del Cardenal Robert Francis Prevost, tomando el nombre de León XIV. Es un momento emocionante en nuestra Iglesia Universal-y nuestra Formación de Fe Familiar está caminando con la iglesia. Las familias están aprendiendo cómo se elige a un Papa, y apreciando cada vez más el Oficio Petrino y cómo las Llaves (autoridad) de San Pedro se transmiten de Pedro a sus sucesores. También aprendimos que nosotros también tenemos un papel importante durante un Cónclave para rezar para que se haga la voluntad de Dios a través de los Cardenales electores. Esta semana, continuamos con este tema reflexionando sobre **Los Apóstoles, nuestra fundación firme**. Sabemos algunas cosas sobre los primeros comienzos de la Iglesia por los Hechos de los Apóstoles. Unos 16 años después de la muerte de Jesús, la decisión del Papa Pedro en el Concilio de Jerusalén (50 d.C.) permitió empezar a predicar a los gentiles. Antes de eso, la mayoría de los seguidores de Jesús eran judíos de nacimiento. Pedro y los demás Apóstoles viajaron como misioneros, sufrieron persecuciones y difundieron la Buena Nueva de la nueva vida a través de la muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo. Nuestros obispos—en colaboración con nuestros sacerdotes y laicos—continúan hoy este ministerio.

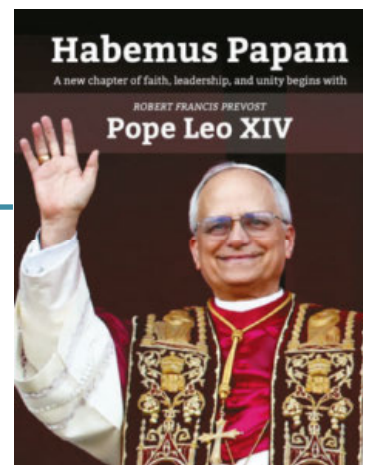

Focus of the Gospel:

The Mass readings for next Sunday, the 6th Sunday of Easter Year C, highlight the themes of the Holy Spirit's guidance, and brings us closer to the heart of the early Church's journey. The readings invite us to reflect on key themes and how to apply them to our lives:

- **Unity in Faith:** The first reading shows the early Church dealing with disagreements. It reminds us that unity in faith requires listening and compromise.
- **Guidance of the Holy Spirit:** The Holy Spirit helps guide the decisions of the apostles in Acts 15:28. We see how the Holy Spirit still guides the Church today.
- **New Jerusalem:** The second reading describes the vision of the New Jerusalem. It represents the hope and promise of a future with God.
- **God's Presence:** In Revelation 21:22-23, we learn there is no need for a temple because God's presence is everywhere. This shows us that God is always with us.
- **Obedience to Jesus:** The Gospel speaks about keeping Jesus' word as a sign of love. Obeying Jesus' teachings brings us closer to Him.
- **Gift of Peace:** Jesus promises peace in John 14:27. This peace is different from what the world offers and calms our hearts.

In our readings, we are reminded to seek the Holy Spirit's guidance in our lives. By opening our hearts to the Holy Spirit, we can find the strength and wisdom needed to make good decisions. Let us trust in the Holy Spirit to lead us, just as it led the apostles, and how it continues to guide the Universal Church in truth and unity.

Enfoque del evangelio:

¿Las lecturas de la Misa del próximo domingo, VI Domingo de Pascua Año C, ponen de relieve los temas de la guía del Espíritu Santo y nos acercan al corazón del camino de la Iglesia primitiva. Las lecturas nos invitan a reflexionar sobre los temas clave y cómo aplicarlos a nuestras vidas:

- ♦ **La unidad en la fe:** La primera lectura muestra a la Iglesia primitiva afrontando los desacuerdos. Nos recuerda que la unidad en la fe exige escucha y compromiso.
- ♦ **La guía del Espíritu Santo:** El Espíritu Santo ayuda a guiar las decisiones de los apóstoles en Hechos 15:28. Vemos cómo el Espíritu Santo sigue guiando a la Iglesia hoy en día.
- ♦ **La Nueva Jerusalén:** La segunda lectura describe la visión de la Nueva Jerusalén. Representa la esperanza y la promesa de un futuro con Dios.
- ♦ **La presencia de Dios:** En Apocalipsis 21:22-23, aprendemos que no hay necesidad de un templo porque la presencia de Dios está en todas partes. Esto nos muestra que Dios siempre está con nosotros.
- ♦ **Obediencia a Jesús:** El Evangelio habla de guardar la palabra de Jesús como signo de amor. Obedecer las enseñanzas de Jesús nos acerca a Él.
- ♦ **Regalo de paz:** Jesús promete la paz en Juan 14:27. Esta paz es diferente de la que ofrece el mundo y tranquiliza nuestros corazones.

En nuestras lecturas, se nos recuerda que busquemos la guía del Espíritu Santo en nuestras vidas. Abriendo nuestros corazones al Espíritu Santo, podemos encontrar la fuerza y la sabiduría necesarias para tomar buenas decisiones. Confíemos en que el Espíritu Santo nos guiará, como guió a los apóstoles, y como sigue guiando a la Iglesia universal en la verdad y la unidad.

Liturgy of the Word

5th Sunday of Easter

May 18, 2025

Reading 1 Acts 14:21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.
