





In this Sunday's Gospel, John the Baptist announces the beginning of Jesus' ministry. John gives us a picture of who Jesus is and what he has come to do. The lamb, the animal that symbolizes the Israelite's liberation from Egypt, shows that Jesus' mission is to give his life for us. The Gospel shows us that Jesus is filled with the Holy Spirit from the beginning of his ministry. This week, take time to reflect on how your family can recognize the Spirit of God in your family life and in the Church.

Jesus came to save us from our sins, and gave us the Sacrament of Baptism as a sign of God's mercy. Talk/reflect on your baptism and how it is a gift.

 **Relación entre el EVANGELIO y la DOCTRINA**

At his baptism, "the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven proclaims, 'This is my beloved Son.' This is the manifestation ('Epiphany') of Jesus as Messiah of Israel and Son of God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 535). "The Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from his conception comes to 'rest on him.' Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind" (CCC, 536).

En su bautismo, "el Espíritu Santo, en forma de paloma, viene sobre Jesús, y la voz del cielo proclama que él es 'mi Hijo amado'. Es la manifestación ('Epifanía') de Jesús como Mesías de Israel e Hijo de Dios" (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 535). "El Espíritu que Jesús posee en plenitud desde su concepción viene a 'posarse' sobre él. De él manará este Espíritu para toda la humanidad (CIC, 536).

Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Holy Trinity (God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) – He's God's active, invisible presence, like a loving helper, teacher, and guide who lives in believers, gives them strength, wisdom, courage, and helps them understand God and grow closer to Him, often shown as a dove.

Espíritu Santo

El Espíritu Santo es la tercera persona de la Santísima Trinidad (Dios Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo). Es la presencia activa e invisible de Dios, como un ayudante, maestro y guía amoroso que vive en los creyentes, les da fuerza, sabiduría y valor, y les ayuda a comprender a Dios y a acercarse más a Él. A menudo se le representa como una paloma.

Resumen de las lecturas:



Summary of the Readings:

- **First Reading** – Isaiah 8:23–9:3: God transformed the fortunes of Zebulun and Naphtali, bringing light to their darkness, joy like a harvest, and breaking the bonds of oppression, reminiscent of Midian's defeat.
- **Responsorial Psalm** – Psalm 27: The Lord is my light, salvation, and stronghold, eliminating all fear. I desire to dwell in His presence forever, confidently expecting to see His goodness in my life.
- **Second Reading** – 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17: Paul urges unity, not divisions in the community, to avoid factions that claim allegiance to different leaders. Christ should be our focus, not human leaders.
- **Gospel** – Matthew 4:12-23: Jesus retreated to Galilee, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy by bringing light to a darkened region. He began preaching repentance and assembled his first disciples, starting his ministry of teaching, proclaiming, and healing.

- **Primera lectura** – Isaías 8:23–9:3: Dios transformó la suerte de Zabulón y Neftalí, trayendo luz a su oscuridad, alegría como una cosecha y rompiendo las cadenas de la opresión, lo que recuerda la derrota de Madián.
- **Salmo responsorial** – Salmo 27: El Señor es mi luz, mi salvación y mi fortaleza, eliminando todo temor. Deseo morar en su presencia para siempre, esperando con confianza ver su bondad en mi vida.
- **Segunda lectura** – 1 Corintios 1:10-13, 17: Pablo insta a la unidad, no a las divisiones en la comunidad, para evitar facciones que reclaman lealtad a diferentes líderes. Cristo debe ser nuestro centro, no los líderes humanos.
- **Evangelio** – Mateo 4:12-23: Jesús se retiró a Galilea, cumpliendo la profecía de Isaías al llevar la luz a una región oscurecida. Comenzó a predicar el arrepentimiento y reunió a sus primeros discípulos, iniciando su ministerio de enseñanza, proclamación y sanación.

Reflect:

The 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A reminds us that God brings light into darkness. We hear the words of Isaiah about a people who once lived in gloom but now see light. This reading shows us that God does not leave us alone. He is near, even in hard times. In the Gospel, Jesus begins preaching and calling his first followers. He brings light to Galilee, a place people often forgot. He tells them to turn their lives around and follow him. His message is simple but clear: the kingdom of heaven is close.

- ◆ Imagine being in a dark room with no light; when a candle light enters in, what do you do? Imagine the whole world is in the dark; Christ (the light) appears. What changes?
- ◆ Christ came into the world to save us from sin and restore community. What are things / people / topics that cause division in your family / community? How can you keep Christ first?
- ◆ Pray Psalm 27.

Reflejar:

El tercer domingo del tiempo ordinario del año A nos recuerda que Dios trae la luz a la oscuridad. Escuchamos las palabras de Isaías sobre un pueblo que antes vivía en la oscuridad, pero que ahora ve la luz. Esta lectura nos muestra que Dios no nos abandona. Él está cerca, incluso en los momentos difíciles. En el Evangelio, Jesús comienza a predicar y a llamar a sus primeros seguidores. Él trae la luz a Galilea, un lugar que la gente solía olvidar. Les dice que cambien sus vidas y lo sigan. Su mensaje es simple pero claro: el reino de los cielos está cerca.

- ◆ Imagina que estás en una habitación oscura sin luz; cuando entra la luz de una vela, ¿qué haces? Imagina que todo el mundo está en la oscuridad; Cristo (la luz) aparece. ¿Qué cambia?
- ◆ Cristo vino al mundo para salvarnos del pecado y restaurar la comunidad. ¿Qué cosas, personas o temas causan división en tu familia o comunidad? ¿Cómo puedes mantener a Cristo en primer lugar?
- ◆ Reza el Salmo 27.







ACTS Ministry

On Sunday January 4, the ACTS Core Team hosted Donut Sunday welcoming parishioners to a time of fellowship and connection after Mass.

ACTS is a parish-based retreat experience centered on Adoration, Community, Theology, and Service. The three-day ACTS retreat invites participants to step away from daily routines, deepen their faith, and build lasting relationships. Because the retreat begins and ends at the parish, ACTS is not just a weekend experience, but a call to ongoing spiritual growth and service. **ACTS will be having two women's retreats this year. June 11-14 will be a Women's retreat in English. November 12-15 will be a Women's Retreat in Spanish.**

The ACTS Core Team is a group of dedicated parishioners who steward the ACTS mission by supporting retreats, mentoring leadership teams, and fostering community throughout the year. In addition to retreats, the Core hosts monthly events that encourage fellowship, faith formation, and service.

Save the date: February 6 for a Holy Hour followed by an ACTS hosted Wine and Cheese Social. All are welcome! Other planned events include Night Fever, a 1/2 day Lenten Retreat plus Movie Night, Paint Night, and Ice Cream socials.

If you are seeking a deeper faith, meaningful community, or a way to serve, ACTS invites you to take that next step.






