Pastor's Corner

I often think about a sonnet written by William Wordsworth that is known as “Nuns fret not.” It is about how small spaces (like a nun in her small cell) and strict guidelines can often feel more liberating than the “weight of too much liberty.” On the surface, the poem is about the clarity of following the strict rules of writing a sonnet as opposed to the developing approach to poetry in free verse. However, the underlying theme is in realizing that a life with strict boundaries and guidelines can be more liberating than a life in which one is free to do anything.


I surmise (not Wordsworth) that we humans just cannot handle too much freedom. Christ frees us by giving us laws and guidelines. A life of liberty can only be free under this yoke of Christ. The law of love and the command to sacrifice that develop through His teaching are the only ways to true freedom. Every other life is slavery.

This weekend we celebrate the civil holiday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Certainly his legacy was about bringing freedom and economic justice to people of color, and of course, all people, for all are united in a common brotherhood and sisterhood. Clearly from his speeches, Dr. King did not separate this freedom and justice from his deep faith in God. To be free at last, was to be free in the promised land of God.

On the surface, that freedom exists. Most of us seem to be free to do whatever we want. God bless Dr. King and everyone else who made great sacrifices to help bring liberty to all who were oppressed in our country, especially our Black brothers and sisters. Yet freedom without the structures of Christ is truly slavery. Our society, our city of Sacramento and even our church are feeling the oppression of “too much liberty.” It is impossible to accept that the death of Dr. King, or Christ, was to give us the freedom to end life, use drugs, change identities, say whatever we want, wander throughout life without direction, and deny God.

We remember that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a Christian minister and his movement was one of leading others to the true freedom of God. Without God in the work towards freedom, there will never be a “free at last, free at last, Great God a-mighty, We are free at last.”

Cathedral History

WAS THE CATHEDRAL FOR SALE?

The small word, "if" looms large in the history of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, whose future refurbishment is one of the goals of the Bishop's Development Fund V Campaign. Therein lies a tale which is practically forgotten by old timers who have followed the saga of the edifice for many decades.

If the third bishop of Sacramento, Patrick J. Keane, had sold the property, as was proposed in the year 1923, what would be the current status of the diocesan mother church? Actually, it almost happened. Here is what took place.

At that point in time, diocesan finances reflected the slump following World War I, and available funds were in desperately short supply. A real estate man negotiated with Bishop Keane, suggesting he could raise one million dollars for the downtown Cathedral property which encompassed a full half block.

The bishop gave strong consideration to the idea, determining that a new cathedral could possibly be constructed for one quarter of that sum, leaving a munificent balance for diocesan needs. It was a time of minimal building costs.

However, the news soon made the rounds and there was a tremendous backlash among old Catholic families, whose personal stance was one of great affection where the cathedral was concerned.

Whether their vociferous objections would have influenced the actual outcome will never be known, for the realtor was unable to come up with the stated purchase price and the status quo remained undisturbed.

There was one diminishment of cathedral property, however. Bishop Keane did sell that portion, at the corner of 12th and K, where the original rectory stood. Presumably, it was a profitable venture, for it called for a new priests' residence which was built on 11th Street. Still inscribed above the entrance are the words, Cathedral Presbytery, a term little used today in favor of the word rectory. The year was 1924. While new quarters were under construction, the bishop and his staff of priests took up residence in a flat at 1012 H Street.

BISHOP KEANE TO BE HONORED TODAY

The installation of Bishop P. J. Keane to the Sacramento bishopric will take place at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament at 10 o'clock this morning'. Bishop Keane is being transferred from the Samaria bishopric by the pope, and is taking the place of the late Bishop Thomas Grace.

Promptly at 10 o'clock over 100 priests will march from the K street entrance of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament around to the main entrance on Eleventh street, down the center aisle of the cathedral to the altar to take part in the installation of Bishop Keane into the Sacramento bishopric.

As the priests march to the altar Bishop Keane will take the throne for the first time. He will then sing the pontifical high mass, assisted by Assistant Priest Dean, Assistant Deacon Ryan, Reverends T. Hayes and M. Kearney, Deacon M. Lyons, Sub-Deacon J. H. Ellis and Master of Ceremonies Rev. E. H. Murphy.

At the close of the ceremony a banquet will be held for the visiting officials.

Priests from Los Angeles, San Francisco, Salt Lake and all the priests of the Sacramento diocese will have a part in the installation service.

Archbishop Hanna of San Francisco will preside and preach. Others officiating will be Bishop P. S. Glass of Salt Lake City and Bishop John J. Cantwell of Los Angeles.

The **CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH** (CDPH) has reported that the incidence of flu and flu-like illnesses is widespread and has reached a level requiring that we enact preventive measures to mitigate the possibility of infection at Mass. In order to protect the health and well-being of everyone, Bishop Soto has issued the following directives:

- The use of the Communion cup is suspended temporarily.
- Receive the Body of Christ in the hand (receiving on the tongue is permitted)
- Do not shake hands. Offer the sign of Peace to those around you with a simple nod, saying "peace be with you."
- Do not hold hands during the Our Father.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days does not apply to those who are sick. If you are sick, stay home and take of yourself. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this time. And pray for those who are sick. The administration of Holy Communion in both kinds will resume as soon as the Bishop deems it safe and prudent to do so.

Esquina del Pastor

A menudo pienso en un soneto escrito por William Wordsworth que se conoce como "Las monjas no se preocupan". Se trata de cómo los espacios pequeños (como una monja en su celda pequeña) y las pautas estrictas a menudo pueden sentirse más liberadores que el "peso de demasiado". libertad. "En la superficie, el poema trata sobre la claridad de seguir las reglas estrictas de escribir un soneto en oposición al enfoque de desarrollo de la poesía en el verso libre. Sin embargo, el tema subyacente es darse cuenta de que una vida con límites y pautas estrictas puede ser más liberadora que una vida en la que uno es libre de hacer cualquier cosa.

Supongo (no Wordsworth) que los humanos no podemos manejar demasiada libertad. Cristo nos libera al darnos leyes y pautas. Una vida de libertad solo puede ser libre bajo este yugo de Cristo. La ley del amor y el mandamiento de sacrificio que se desarrolla a través de su enseñanza son las únicas formas de la verdadera libertad. Cada otra vida es esclavitud.

Este fin de semana celebramos la fiesta civil del Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Ciertamente, su legado fue sobre la libertad y la justicia económica para las personas de color, y por supuesto, todas las personas, para todos, están unidas en una hermandad y hermandad comunes. Claramente de sus discursos, el Dr. King no separó esta libertad y justicia de su profunda fe en Dios. Ser libre al fin, era ser libre en la tierra prometida de Dios.

Recordamos que el Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. era un ministro cristiano y su movimiento fue uno de los líderes de otros a la verdadera libertad de Dios. Sin Dios en el trabajo hacia la libertad, nunca habrá un "libre al fin, libre al fin, Gran Dios poderoso, somos libres al fin."

VERSO DEL EVANGELIO DE DOMINGO

Como llegara a faltar el vino, María le dijo a Jesús: "Ya no tienen vino". Jesús le contestó: "Mujer, ¿qué podemos hacer tú y yo? Todavía no llega mi hora". Pero ella dijo a los que servían: "Hagan lo que él les diga". - Jn 2, 3-5

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Hoy, dejamos el Evangelio de Lucas para escuchar el de Juan. En este, se narra el primer signo de Jesús en la boda de Caná. Juan le dice signos a lo que Lucas llama milagros y en este caso se resalta la señal manifiesta, de la dignidad eminente de Cristo. En la escena de la boda Jesús aparece como el que trae un vino nuevo a petición de su Madre María. "Todo el mundo sirve al principio el vino mejor, y cuando ya todos han bebido bastante, les dan el de menos calidad; pero tú has dejado el mejor vino para el final" (Juan 2:10). Con este signo milagroso, sale lo viejo y entra lo nuevo para quedarse para siempre.

"Esta señal milagrosa fue la primera, y Jesús la hizo en Caná de Galilea. Así se manifestó su gloria y sus discípulos creyeron en él" (Juan 2:11). El sacerdote español, José Luis Martín Descalzo (1930-1991), lo explica así: "La vida pública de Jesús comienza con una fiesta. Porque el anuncio de la buena nueva sólo puede empezar con un estallido de alegría. Cristo no puede presentarse ante los hombres como un aguafiestas que viene a rebajar el vino de la alegría. Él trae un vino mejor, no una tinaja de aburrimiento. Quizás algunos hubieran preferido un funeral o quizás una solemne liturgia en el gran templo". En el banquete actual que es la Eucaristía, entramos todos sin distinción de raza ni color; todos somos bienvenidos a celebrar la presencia real de Cristo entre nosotros. Sigamos atentos a la voz de la Madre. "Hagan lo que él les diga" (Juan 2:5). Es un mensaje que se aplica para entonces y para hoy.

教宗聖安旦路斯駕崩後，教會人士群聚一堂，推選新教宗，一隻鴿子突然飛下，棲留在法俾盎的頭上。由於這個異象，再加上信眾的一致擁戴，法俾盎就當選為教宗。聖人在位的時候，將歷代殉道者的言行蒐羅成冊，對聖教禮儀頒定了很多有意義的規則。其最著名的，是建定聖體大禮日祝聖聖油的禮儀。在位第十五年的時候，為主捐軀而死，時為主曆二五零年，羅馬德西烏斯皇執政的時代。

St. Fabian (January 20)

After Pope Anterus died, the church members gathered to elect the new pope, and a pigeon suddenly flew down and stayed on the head of Fabian. Because of this vision, coupled with the unanimous support

of the believers, Fabian was elected as the Pope. When the saints were in power, they collected the words and deeds of the martyrs of the past and made many meaningful rules on the etiquette. The most important etiquette is to establish the blessing of the holy oil on the Feast of the Eucharist. In 250 A.D., the fifteenth year of his reign, he died a martyr at the beginning of the Decian's persecution.
