THE IRON GIANT

The Iron Giant (1999) is celebrated as a “modern animated classic” that blends heartwarming friendship with Cold War-era tension, despite initial marketing railures. Directed by Brad Bird, the film is a critically acclaimed masterpiece focusing on themes of choice, identity, and humanity, featuring the iconic mantra: “You are who you choose to be”.

FUN FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY!

Is AI an inevitable threat to mankind?

What safeguards would be necessary to be in place for humanity to be assured of its benevolent use? Does AI have the real ability to create or evolve into an “Artificial Equivalent” of the human soul, able to think and act on its own volition? The answers to these questions are explored in the film, *The Iron Giant*; the featured film of the upcoming Cinema, Divina Movie Night presentation.

Directing our attention to the teaching of the Catholic Church on the creation of the **human soul**; Paragraphs 365 and 366 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church state; **365** “The unity of soul and body is so profound that one has to consider the soul to be the form of the body: I.e., it is because of its spiritual soul that the body made of matter becomes a living, human body; spirit and matter in man are not two natures united, but rather their union forms a single nature. **366** “The Church teaches that every spiritual soul is created immediately by God –it is not “produced” by the parents–and also that it is immortal: It does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final Resurrection.”

EL CUERPO Y LA SANGRE DE CRISTO

First Reading – Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14B-16A: God led and tested the Israelites in the desert, providing manna and water, to show that life depends on His word.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 147: Praise the Lord for strengthening Jerusalem, granting peace, and sharing his word and laws with Israel.

Second Reading – 1 Corinthians 10:16-17: The cup and bread we bless signify our sharing in Christ's blood and body, uniting us as one body.

Gospel – John 6:51-58: Jesus declares He is the living bread from heaven. To have eternal life, we must eat His flesh and drink His blood, ensuring our union with Him and eternal life.

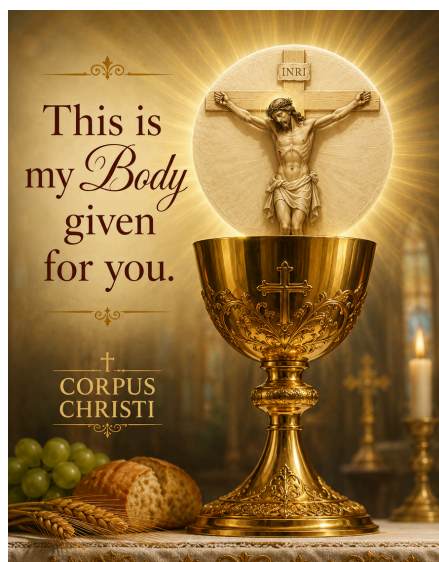
In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus declares He is the *living bread from heaven*. **To have eternal life, one must eat His flesh and drink His blood, ensuring union with Him and eternal life.**

This is no metaphor. This is the fulfillment of every hunger the desert was meant to awaken. The manna sustained bodies for a day — and then the people grew hungry again. But Christ, the Bread of Life, satisfies at the level of eternity. By instituting the Eucharist, Jesus gave us His very life — His body, blood, soul, and divinity — to consume and, therefore, reap the benefits of what He did for us on the cross. St. Paul draws out the breathtaking consequence: the cup and bread we bless signify our sharing in Christ's blood and body, uniting us as one body. Every Mass is not a memorial of something distant — it is a participation in the living reality of Christ's sacrifice, made present here and now. While Holy Thursday during Holy Week recalls Christ's institution of the Eucharist, at the Last Supper, Corpus Christi gives Catholics a joyful opportunity to honor our Eucharistic Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The Church celebrates Corpus Christi to profess and adore our Eucharistic Lord. **Jesus is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — in the Eucharist. At every Mass we partake of the Lamb of God, the New Covenant Passover sacrifice.**

En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús declara que Él es el pan vivo que viene del cielo. **Para alcanzar la vida eterna, hay que comer su carne y beber su sangre, asegurando así la unión con Él y la vida eterna.** No se trata de una metáfora. Es el colmo de todo ese hambre que el desierto debía despertar. El maná alimentaba los cuerpos durante un día, y luego el pueblo volvía a tener hambre. Pero Cristo, el Pan de Vida, sacia a nivel de la eternidad. Al instituir la Eucaristía, Jesús nos dio su propia vida —su cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad— para que la consumiéramos y, por lo tanto, cosechéramos los beneficios de lo que hizo por nosotros en la cruz.

San Pablo destaca la impresionante consecuencia: la copa y el pan que bendecimos significan nuestra participación en la sangre y el cuerpo de Cristo, uniéndonos como un solo cuerpo. Cada misa no es un recuerdo de algo lejano, sino una participación en la realidad viva del sacrificio de Cristo, hecho presente aquí y ahora.

Mientras que el Jueves Santo, durante la Semana Santa, recuerda la institución de la Eucaristía por parte de Cristo en la Última Cena, el Corpus Christi ofrece a los católicos una alegre oportunidad de honrar a nuestro Señor Eucarístico Jesús en el Santísimo Sacramento. La Iglesia celebra el Corpus Christi para profesar y adorar a nuestro Señor Eucarístico. **Jesús está verdaderamente presente —cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad— en la Eucaristía. En cada misa participamos del Cordero de Dios, el sacrificio pascual de la Nueva Alianza.**

Salmo responsorial – Salmo 147: Alabado sea el Señor por fortalecer a Jerusalén, conceder la paz y compartir su palabra y sus leyes con Israel.

Segunda lectura – 1 Corintios 10, 16-17: La copa y el pan que bendecimos simbolizan nuestra participación en la sangre y el cuerpo de Cristo, uniéndonos como un solo cuerpo.

Evangelio – Juan 6, 51-58: Jesús declara que Él es el pan vivo que viene del cielo. Para tener vida eterna, debemos comer su carne y beber su sangre, asegurando así nuestra unión con Él y la vida eterna.

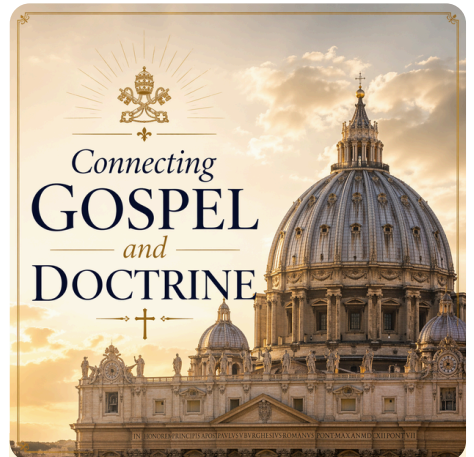

Jesus connects reception of the Eucharist directly to eternal life — not merely moral improvement or communal bonding, but *life everlasting*. The Eucharist is medicine for the soul, pledge of the resurrection, and foretaste of the heavenly banquet. As the Catechism states: **"The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life'"** (CCC 1324). This is how we remain in Him and receive eternal life — the Eucharist is His way of staying with us.

PREPARACIÓN PARA LA MISA DEL PRÓXIMO DOMINGO • 09

NEXT SUNDAY MASS PREPARATION JUNE 14, 2026 – 11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

- **First Reading** – Exodus 19:2-6a: The Israelites arrive at Mount Sinai, where God speaks to the people through Moses, reminding the Israelites of how He delivered them from slavery in Egypt and declares that if they obey His commands and keep His covenant, they will be a treasured possession and a kingdom of priests.
- **Responsorial Psalm** – Psalm 100: We are his people: the sheep of his flock.
- **Second Reading** – Romans 5:6-11: God showed His love for humanity by sending Jesus Christ to die for our sins. Through Jesus' sacrifice, we can be reconciled with God and receive the gift of eternal life.
- **Gospel** – Matthew 9:36-10:8: Jesus has compassion for the crowds. He sends out His twelve disciples to heal the sick, raise the dead, and proclaim the good news of the kingdom of heaven.

- **Primera lectura** – Éxodo 19, 2-6a: Los israelitas llegan al monte Sinaí, donde Dios se dirige al pueblo a través de Moisés, recordándoles cómo los liberó de la esclavitud en Egipto y declarando que, si obedecen sus mandamientos y guardan su alianza, serán un pueblo preciado y un reino de sacerdotes.
- **Salmo responsorial** – Salmo 100: Somos su pueblo: las ovejas de su rebaño.
- **Segunda lectura** – Romanos 5, 6-11: Dios mostró su amor por la humanidad enviando a Jesucristo a morir por nuestros pecados. A través del sacrificio de Jesús, podemos reconciliarnos con Dios y recibir el don de la vida eterna.
- **Evangelio** – Mateo 9, 36-10, 8: Jesús tiene compasión de las multitudes. Envía a sus doce discípulos a curar a los enfermos, resucitar a los muertos y proclamar la buena nueva del reino de los cielos.

Reflect:

The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A highlights the great love of God. The second reading tells how Jesus died for sinners. He did not wait for people to be perfect. He gave His life while they were still far from God.

This kind of love is hard to understand. People often love those who love them back. But God loves without condition. He does not wait for people to deserve His mercy. He offers it freely, no matter their past mistakes.

Act:

God calls us to accept His love. It is also a call to share it with others. Just as God forgives, His people must also forgive. Just as He loves without limits, they must also love.

How are you going to love as God loves this week? Who is the one in your life that needs to know such a love exists?

Reflexión:

El undécimo domingo del tiempo ordinario, año A, pone de relieve el gran amor de Dios. La segunda lectura narra cómo Jesús murió por los pecadores. No esperó a que las personas fueran perfectas. Entregó su vida cuando aún estaban lejos de Dios.

Este tipo de amor es difícil de comprender. A menudo, las personas aman a quienes les corresponden. Pero Dios ama sin condiciones. No espera a que las personas se ganen su misericordia. La ofrece gratuitamente, independientemente de los errores del pasado.

Acción:

Dios nos llama a aceptar su amor. También es una llamada a compartirlo con los demás. Al igual que Dios perdona, su pueblo también debe perdonar. Al igual que Él ama sin límites, ellos también deben amar.

¿Cómo vas a amar esta semana tal y como ama Dios? ¿Quién es esa persona en tu vida que necesita saber que existe un amor así?

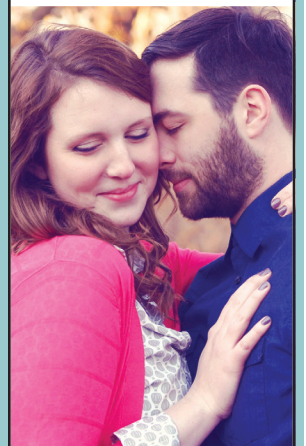

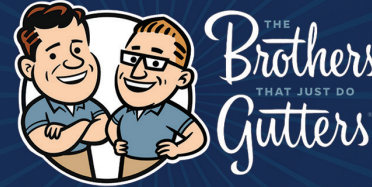

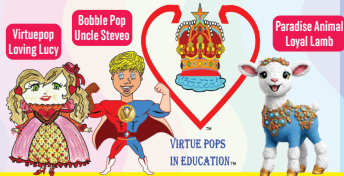
